Introductions

Review and discussion of concerns from survey and February 13, 2007 community meeting

16th Avenue

Concerns not totally clear

California

- Double parking near the ballet school at 17th Ave
- Double parking delays traffic and buses and encourages vehicles to use Lake
- Loading zones possible?
- California is an arterial, so traffic should be encouraged to use that street
- Discourage more STOP signs along California
- Look for other ways to increase pedestrian safety along California

California vs. Lake

- California used to carry more vehicles
- Now Lake has fewer STOP signs (4 vs. 3) between 25th Ave and Park Presidio Blvd.
- Drivers use path of least resistance Lake
- Do more to encourage vehicles to stay on California, the arterial

17th Avenue/ Geary

- Potential gateway treatment?
- Bleak pedestrian area; possible location for trees?

18th Ave between Geary and Clement

- A church and YMCA brings more traffic to 18th
- There is a high level of speeding between Geary and Clement, especially at night

18th Ave between Clement and California

- Rec Center draws a lot of pedestrians
- Need to improve pedestrian crossings at 18th and Clement

19th and 20th Aves

No comments submitted at community meeting or via survey

21st Ave near Geary

- Some cut through traffic is encouraged since there is no signal at 22nd Ave
- This may be balanced out since vehicles can't turn left off of Geary at 21st, but they can at 22nd Ave

General concern about speeding on all Avenues

Especially between Geary and Clement

21st and Lake

- STOP sign request
- Maybe improving site lines by limiting tall vehicles or creating small red zones may help
- STOP sign at 17th and California made traffic worse on Lake

22nd Ave between California and Clement

- Alamo school should get extra attention
- Also on 23rd (the other side of school)

Muni drivers going to pick up passengers on the express routes sometimes speed on residential, non-bus route streets

Project Goals

- The project will look to lower 85th percentile speeds to close to 25 MPH and definitely below 30MPH
- A survey at the end of the project will ask for people's feel about things like pedestrian safety and aesthetics

Next Steps

- We will work to gather speed and volume data for locations discussed at this meeting and for locations brought up by the greater community by survey and at the community meeting
- Once that data is collected, we will hold another working group meeting, probably in June or July
