CONSENT CALENDAR

10. All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors and will be acted upon by a single vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Board of Directors or the public so requests, in which event the matter shall be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered as a separate item.

- (10.1) Approving the following parking and traffic modifications:
 - A. ESTABLISH 1-HOUR PARKING, 7 AM TO 6 PM, EVERYDAY EXCEPT SUNDAYS Irving Street, north side, between 46th Avenue and 47th Avenue.
 - B. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA R 555 Golden Gate Avenue.
 - C. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA U 345-363 6th Street.
 - D. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C 610 Hyde Street.
 - E. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C 1005 Larkin Street and 1002 Post Street.
 - F. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA S 3914-3916 24th Street. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. For every parking and traffic modification that received a categorical exemption, the proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.)
- (10.2) Adopting a resolution of local support for the programming of State Transportation Improvement Program funds in the amount of \$10,642,000 for the Phase 3 (N-Judah) segment of the SFMTA's Train Control Upgrade Program in Fiscal Year 2025/26; and providing assurances to comply with Metropolitan Transportation Commission policies. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)
- (10.3) Approving retroactively an extension of the six-month promotional program waiving Muni and Paratransit Fares for customers traveling to and from COVID-19 vaccination and vaccination booster appointments from September 17, 2021 through September 16, 2022, and expansion of the program to include a parent/guardian when accompanying a minor, approving the Title VI analysis of the impact of the proposed fare change on low-income and minority communities in San Francisco, and waiving Article 4, Section 10 of the SFMTA Board Rules of Order since the scheduled public hearing is not less than five days after the last publication of notice. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

- 11. Adopting the Lake Merced Pedestrian Safety Community-Based Transportation Plan. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)
- 12. Awarding Contract No. 1313R1, 16th Street Improvement Project to JMB Construction to install traffic signals, overhead wires, pedestrian and transit bulbs, and to replace the sewer on 16th Street between Church Street and Potrero Streets, in the amount of \$16,269,609, and for a term of 550 days to Substantial Completion and making environmental review findings. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution and finance plan.)
- 13. Authorizing the Director to execute Contract Nos. 2020-65-FTA and 2020-68-FTA for As-Needed Transit Corridor Planning and Engineering Services, with HNTB Corporation and NN Engineering, respectively, each contract in an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000, and for a three-year term with two optional one-year extensions. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)
- 14. Authorizing the Director to execute Modification No. 14 to Contract No. 1289, Van Ness Corridor Transit Improvement Project, with Walsh Construction Company to perform various roadway work in

the amount of \$717,877.56, for a total Contract amount not to exceed \$222,465,143.57, with no time extension, and making environmental review findings. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution, and finance plan.)

ADJOURN

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions</u>: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
