





Bay Wheels Bike Facilities Map











Lyon at Lombard — currently in Clty review. Likely will be the next Marina station to be scheduled for a public hearing. I'll let you know when that is scheduled





Hi Adrian,

Thanks very much for the update.

We may need to have another follow up conversation on the following:

- Laguna/Washington. Can you update us on the latest discuss with the community on this?
- Filbert/Fillmore. We still have significant concerns regarding this location. Notwithstanding the ShakeShack parklet, significant traffic at this particular intersection and adjacent intersections at Fillmore and Pixley and Fillmore and Union also contribute to the concerns that we have regarding pedestrian and biker safety. Moreover, there is still a lot up in the air with regard to parklets and when they will have to modify their spaces. Tom - has anyone been out to this intersection for a site visit recently, or in the weekend evening house? Can we discuss other traffic calming measures that can be put in along these three blocks? We still feel very strongly that, like with the proposed locations along Chestnut, this location was approved prior to the Shared Spaces era of curb management planning and that this location is no longer ideal for a placement of a bikeshare station.

Hello Dominica,

Wanted to update you on Bikeshare Program plans based on modifications from the latest Supervisor input, community feedback, and MTA analysis. We've moved a few stations around for improved abutter support, drilled down into alternatives, and modified the system for Shared Spaces needs.

These stations are permitted and slated for installation Q1 2022.

- · North Point Divisadero, sidewalk
- Laguna Washington Lafayette Park, sidewalk

These stations have identified sites. We will keep you updated as they move along.

- Lyon/Lombard, sidewalk next step Public Hearing
- Scott /California, on-street next step Public Hearing
- Clay and Lyon, on-street stakeholder outreach, then Public Hearing adjacent to SFPL
- Divisadero/Lombard, on-street stakeholder outreach, then Public Hearing

- shifted from previous proposal
- adjacent to Walgreens

As identified by the Supervisor, with newer Shared Spaces considerations, we dug into the following proposals to identify how to adjust these sites in the revised context.

- Filbert and Fillmore The current Shared Space here will be shortened per new Shared Spaces legislation. After that, the remaining space will fit the legislate site. This station was already permitted. I'm happy to reach out to Shake Shack again to let them know of these plans.
- Pierce and Chestnut After assessing the infeasibility of the alternative location in the MTA garage, due to lack of solar power availability, low visibility, and unfriendly bike/pedestrian conditions, SFMTA intends to proceed with the original location in the first two stalls on the east side of Pierce, just south of Chestnut.

Thanks again for advancing this discussion at the last MTA-Supervisor check-in. Let us know if you have concerns. We will otherwise proceed and keep you updated.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) proposes to implement a city-wide bicycle sharing system in San Francisco as part of the regional Bay Area Bicycle Share (BABS) system described in detail below. The current regional bicycle share system in San Francisco is a pilot project managed by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD). The regional BABS system will transfer to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) for program oversight at the end of 2015. As part of a BABS pilot project initiated on August 29, 2013, the system operator installed approximately 35 bicycle share stations with input from the SFMTA, comprising 350 bicycles within the public right-of-way, located generally in the northeast section of the City. The proposed project would maintain and upgrade the existing 35 pilot bicycle share stations, and expand the BABS system within San Francisco to comprise a total of approximately 450 stations and 4,500 bicycles across the City and County of San Francisco (San Francisco).

DETERMINATION:

The City and County of San Francisco decided to carry out or approve the project on December 18, 2015. The San Francisco Board of Supervisors (BOS) approved a coordination agreement with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), other local partners in the East and South Bay, and the bicycle share operator to carry out the Bay Area Bicycle Share Program, which would be overseen in San Francisco by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) on December 8, 2015. The agreement was provided to Mayor Lee for his signature and becomes effective upon signing or when ten days have passed. A copy of documents related to this action may be examined at the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, City Hall, 1 Carlton B. Goodlett Place Room 244, San Francisco, CA, 94102 in File Number 151144.

This project in its approved form has been determined to be exempt from environmental review because it would result in the installation of up to 450 bicycle sharing stations throughout San Francisco, primarily within the public right-of-way and on some parcels. The proposed individual stations are portable, modular, and would be solar and battery powered, and would thus not involve excavation or utility connections. The bicycle sharing station equipment is small in scale and massing relative to surrounding buildings or sites. Bicycle facilities and infrastructure are common sights within the urban environment. There would be no potential for significant environmental impacts at either a project or cumulative level. Therefore, the proposed project would be exempt from environmental review under Class 3.
