

#### Sustainable Streets Division Directive Order No. 6664

Pursuant to the public hearing held on June 2, 2023, traffic movement and safety may be improved by the changes approved below. The Environmental Clearance for these items is noted on Order No. 6656.

#### 1. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C (Eligibility only, no signs)

839 Post Street (Supervisor District 3) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Raynell Cooper, raynell.cooper@SFMTA.com

Allowing residents to purchase RPP Area C permits for nearby RPP-regulated streets.

Proposal to replace time-limited parking to paid parking.

Lombard Street, eastbound, at Laguna Street

Proposal to revise an existing NO LEFT TURN restriction exemption for Muni, allowing Muni buses to make this turn at other times as needed for the 43 Masonic Muni route.

Proposal to implement third phase of AB43 which allowed cities in California to lower speed limits to 20 MPH in designated businesses districts that meet criteria such as at least 50 percent commercial frontage, on-street parking, and four or fewer lanes.

Winston Drive, both sides, from Lake Merced Boulevard to Buckingham Way Buckingham Way, both sides, Unit, 100, 200, and 300 Blocks (Supervisor District 7) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley,

Proposal to establish weekday daytime parking time limits on Winston Drive to support parking availability for SF State University faculty, students, staff, and visitors.

**Public Comments:** Comments from District 7 Board of Supervisors aide, Emma Heiken, regarding intentions and public outreach. Comments from Coalition of Homelessness regarding helping vehicle



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habitants prior to implementation. Other comments to monitor the implementation and enforcement of the restriction.

**Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.

#### 11. ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Scott Street, west side, from Duboce Avenue to 15 feet northerly (Supervisor District 8) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Simon Qin, simon.qin@sfmta.com

Proposal to add 15-foot daylighting red zone to improve visibility for vehicles and pedestrians.

**Public Comments:** One question on positions dedicated to hospital safety similar to School Safety Engineer. Some emails in opposition received after the public hearing. **Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer for implementation.

#### 12(a). RESCIND – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY ESTABLISH – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA W PERMITS

Utah Street, east side, from 25th Street to south terminus

#### 12(b). RESCIND – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY

Utah Street, west side, from 25th Street to south terminus (Supervisor District 9) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Raynell Cooper, raynell.cooper@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish time limit parking regulation to a currently unregulated block face (west side) and extend RPP permit parking on a block face with a general time limit (east side).

#### Public Comments: No comments.

**Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.

#### **GENERAL COMMENTS:**

Whether or not the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, it is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If the City Traffic Engineer disapproves or declines a parking or traffic modification, a member of the public must request additional review by the SFMTA of that decision which shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code before the

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decision becomes a Final SFMTA Decision. Final SFMTA Decisions, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Decisions reviewable by the Board of Supervisors are denoted with a pound (**#**).
