5. Public Comment

Members of the public may address the Vision Zero Committee on matters that are within the Committee's jurisdiction and are not on today's calendar.

Paul Wormer expressed concern about city vehicles parking in daylighting zones.

Griffin Lee spoke about public trust and encouraged more engagement with community to gather different perspectives.

Glennis shared about living in San Francisco and an experience seeing a pedestrian fatality.

Director Cajina joined the meeting.



Speaker expressed frustration as a motorist living in San Francisco.

6. Presentation and discussion regarding the San Francisco Street Safety Initiative including possible action by the Committee to recommend that the SFMTA Board of Directors adopt the SFMTA Street Safety Commitments. (Explanatory documents include a slide presentation.)

Viktoriya Wise, Director of Streets, presented the item.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Jodie Mederios thanked staff for working quickly on the Safe Streets Initiative and expressed concern about Vision Zero metrics.

Griffin Lee commented about vehicles miles traveled and expressed concern about Slow Streets, sharing that they need to be reevaluated.

Speaker commented on Slow Streets and expressed concern about design and recognition by users of Slow Streets.

Speaker expressed support for continued engagement with the community in meaningful ways.

Paul Wormer expressed support for additional speed safety cameras, including at stop signs or where there are hills and visibility concerns.

Speaker expressed concern about speed on Lake Street and urged the agency to communicate better.

Speaker expressed support for more visibility on changes to streets and urged the agency to be aggressive as possible with VZ.

Robin Pam commented on micro-mobility and about not having a plan to add streets to Slow Streets in spite of the community asking for them.

Claire Amable expressed concern about commitments and the ability to achieve outcomes, while also commenting about adding only three miles over the next 18 months.

On motion to recommend that the SFMTA Board of Directors support staff's proposal including: (1) adopting the Safe System Approach to roadway safety, (2) committing to the SFMTA Street Safety Commitments including guidance to advance commitments in equity



priority neighborhoods; and (3) committing to implementing the actions set forth in the Street Safety Act and the Street Safety Initiative.

7. Presentation and discussion regarding updates to Committee Member Requests from the October 28, 2025 meeting. (Explanatory documents include a slide presentation.)

Viktoriya Wise, Director of Streets, presented the item.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Speaker thanked staff for the daylighting work.

Jodie Mederios expressed concern about the red-light camera program and urged the agency to take a bolder approach.

Barry Taranto commented about enforcement, double parking and cars blocking transit routes and red lanes.

Director Hinze and Director Cajina requested an update on the Parking Control Officer program including deployment.

Director Hinze requested an update on automated enforcement and maximization opportunities.

Director Cajina requested a presentation on the High Injury Network once published.

Director Chen requested an update on the efficacy of the red-light camera program.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Speaker thanked directors and staff for their work and encouraged them to keep forging ahead.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
