San Francisco Giants Baseball Games

Haight Ashbury Street Fair

Sunday, June 9: The 42nd annual Haight Ashbury Street Fair will take place in the Haight-Ashbury District. The event will be held from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. For event details, visit Haight Ashbury Street Fair.

The following street closures will be required from 3 a.m. to 9 p.m on Sunday:

- Haight Street between Masonic and Stanyan streets
- Ashbury Street between Page and Waller streets
- Clayton Street between Page and Waller streets
- Cole Street between Page and Waller streets
- Belvedere Street between Page and Waller streets
- Shrader Street between Page and Waller streets
- Intersections: Ashbury, Clayton, Shrader, Cole and Belvedere at Haight Street

The following Muni line and routes will be affected: N Judah (Early Morning Buses Only); 7 Haight/Noriega; 33 Ashbury/18th; 37 Corbett and 43 Masonic.

Event participants are encouraged to take public transportation to the event as street parking will be limited in the area. Monitored bicycle parking will be available on Cole Street between Page and Haight streets.

Escape From Alcatraz Triathlon

Sunday, June 9: The annual "Escape from Alcatraz" Triathlon will begin at 7:30 a.m. with a swim from a barge off of Alcatraz into the beach next to the St. Francis Yacht Club.

Bike riders will leave Marina Green, then bike into the Presidio to the Great Highway through Golden Gate Park and back to the Marina for the run to Baker Beach and back to the finish line on Marina Green.

The northernmost lanes of Marina Boulevard between Scott and Lyon streets will be closed between 5:30 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Note: Marina Boulevard will be open for both eastbound and westbound traffic with an exception of one lane closure in each direction.

The route of the bicycle portion of the triathlon will be as follows: from Marina Green into the Presidio to Legion of Honor Drive, right on Clement to Great Highway, through Golden Gate Park via Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive to Transverse, and return via John F. Kennedy Drive on the same route to Marina Green.

The entire bike route will be heavily monitored by San Francisco Police Department personnel, SFMTA Parking Control Officers and race officials. Traffic will be slow in the affected areas and motorists may be delayed as the race passes.

The route of the running portion of the triathlon will be as follows: from Marina Green into the Presidio, down to Baker Beach and back to the finish line on the Marina Green.

The following Muni routes will be affected by the triathlon: **18 46th Avenue**; **29 Sunset**; **38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid**.

5K@ADA

Sunday, June 9: There will be a fundraising run/walk associated with the ADA convention at Moscone Center. For event details, visit https://www.ada5k.com/.

The event will start and finish at Pier 32, with the bulk of the route being along the Embarcadero pathway. Approximately 1,200 participants are expected.

The following street closures will be required from 5:45 a.m. to 7:15 a.m., Sunday:

- The Embarcadero between 2nd and Mission streets
- King Street between 2nd and 3rd streets
- 3rd Street between King Street and Terry A. Francois Boulevard

There will be no impact on Muni service.



Sikh Parade and Festival

Sunday, June 9: The Sikh Parade will take place along Market Street and the festival will be held in the Civic Center Plaza.

Starting at 10 a.m., the parade units will gather along 2nd Street between Market and Howard streets. Cross traffic will be allowed on Mission Street during staging. At noon, the parade will move west along Market Street to McAllister Street, then proceed south on Larkin Street and enter the Civic Center Plaza from the Larkin Street side where the parade will disband and the festival will begin.

There will be a street closure of Grove Street between Polk and Larkin streets from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the festival. Westbound Market Street will be closed for the parade. Traffic on cross streets will be allowed, but will be held while the parade is passing. San Francisco Police Officers will be present to control traffic. When the parade units pass, SFPD officers will resume and re-open streets. Motorists are advised to allow extra travel time.

The following Muni lines and routes will be affected: F Market & Wharves; 2 Clement; 5 Fulton; 6 Haight/Parnassus; 7 Haight/Noriega; 8 Bayshore; 9 San Bruno; 10 Townsend; 12 Folsom/Pacific; 19 Polk; 21 Hayes; 27 Bryant; 30 Stockton; 31 Balboa; 38 Geary; 38R Geary Rapid and 45 Union/Stockton.

Sunday Streets - Sunset/Golden Gate Park

Sunday, June 9: The fifth Sunday Streets event will be held in the Sunset District, traveling through Golden Gate Park and along the Great Highway. The Sunset Sunday Streets event will cover a route between John F. Kennedy Drive at Transverse Drive and Great Highway at Sloat Boulevard. The route will be available for recreational activities from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The event is free to all participants.

The headquarters for the event will be located at John F. Kennedy Drive at Transverse Drive, where participants can get details about activities along the event route as well as at Lincoln Boulevard and Great Highway.

<u>Sunday Streets – Sunset/Golden Gate Park continued</u>

The following street closures for motor vehicles will be required from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Sunday:

- Westbound Lincoln Way between Great Highway and Martin Luther King Jr. Drive
- Great Highway between Sloat Blvd and Lincoln Way
- Martin Luther King Jr. Dr between Lincoln Way to Middle Dr W
- Transverse Dr. from Middle Dr West to John F. Kennedy Drive
- John F. Kennedy Dr from Transverse Dr. to the regular Sunday car free street under Crossover Dr.

Golf course access will be allowed at Fulton and 47th Avenue only.

Through traffic will be allowed on:

- Chain of Lakes Drive between 43rd Avenue (north side of Golden Gate Park) and 41st Avenue (south side of Golden Gate Park)
- Northbound and Southbound Highway 1
- Crossover Drive to 25th Avenue
- Southbound Great Highway to Lincoln Way

La Playa Street at Lincoln Way will be open for eastbound traffic.

Personnel from the San Francisco Police Department, Recreation and Park Department and the SFMTA will be present to control traffic.

The **18 46th Avenue** Muni route will be affected.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: Twin Peaks Tunnel Temporary Closures

To allow crews to do track maintenance work, there are planned temporary closures scheduled for the Twin Peaks Tunnel **the mornings of Saturday, June 8 and Sunday, June 9, from start of service to 10 a.m.** This brief closure includes the West Portal and Forest Hill stations. During that time, bus shuttles will be provided for the K, L and M lines. Trains will continue to serve all stations between Castro and Embarcadero.

<u>UPDATE: Twin Peaks Tunnel Temporary Closures continued</u>

<u>K Ingleside</u>

- **Inbound:** Trains will serve regular stops from Balboa Park to St. Francis Circle, where customers must transfer to shuttle buses. Buses will serve shuttle bus stops from St. Francis Circle to Embarcadero Station.
- **Outbound:** Bus shuttles will run from Castro to St. Francis Circle.

L Taraval

- **Inbound:** No train service. L inbound buses will serve all stops from the Zoo (46th/Wawona) to Embarcadero Station.
- **Outbound:** No train service. L outbound buses will run from Castro to the Zoo (46th/Wawona).

M Ocean View

- **Inbound:** Trains will serve regular stops from Balboa Park to St. Francis Circle, where customers must transfer to shuttle buses. Buses will serve shuttle bus stops from St. Francis Circle to Embarcadero Station.
- **Outbound:** Bus shuttles will run from Castro to St. Francis Circle.

To accommodate bus shuttles, parking will be temporarily restricted on the east side of West Portal Avenue from Portola to 15th Avenue and on the north side of Market Street from Castro to 16th Street.

UPDATE: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' arena, the SFMTA is constructing a new 320-foot center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. The existing platform has been demolished. The new track alignment will include one single and one double crossover to facilitate the movement of vehicles as operations requires. Other associated work includes modification of the overhead contact system, and both above and below ground utility relocation work. Construction will require different phases of work that will necessitate separate transit service plans. For more information visit www.SFMTA.com/MissionBayPlatform.

Work will continue on the platform and surrounding streets through June, with some street closures anticipated in the coming weeks to allow for road repaving.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

On Friday, June 7, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to conduct street water work and post foundation work at the following locations:

- Van Ness at Lombard Street
- Van Ness at Greenwich Street
- Van Ness at Filbert Street
- Van Ness at Union Street
- Van Ness at Washington Street
- Van Ness at Clay Street
- Van Ness at Sacramento Street
- Van Ness at California Street
- Van Ness at Pine Street
- Van Ness at Bush Street
- Van Ness at Otis Street
- Van Ness at Mission Street

On Saturday, June 8, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m., crews are scheduled to conduct sewage work and post foundation work at the following locations:

- Van Ness at Washington Street
- Van Ness at Clay Street

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in summer 2019. Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop continued

A partial street closure is currently in effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18th and 19th streets through summer of 2019. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.

ONGOING: Central Subway Project

In Chinatown, the sidewalk on the west side of Stockton Street, south of Washington Street, adjacent to the worksite is temporarily closed to facilitate utility upgrade work. There is currently one lane of traffic open on both sides of Stockton between Clay and Jackson streets. Upcoming Construction Project

Muni Track Work at Market and 5th streets

Starting Monday, June 17 and will continue for six days or until it is completed, track maintenance work will take place on Market Street, between 5th and 6th streets. During construction, the F Market & Wharves rail service will operate without interruption. While Market Street remains open, vehicular traffic along 5th Street will have to make right turns, however buses are allowed to cross Market Street.

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. except for Sunday, June 23 when the street paving will be occurring from 2 a.m. to 2 p.m.



<u>Upcoming Construction Project continued</u>

Muni Track Work at Market and 5th streets continued

During construction:

- While measures are being taken to minimize inconveniences, neighbors and local merchants can expect some noise during demolition.
- To accommodate the construction, the southbound 27 Bryant bus stop north of Market Street at 5th Street (Cyril Magnin Street) will be temporarily relocated to south of Market Street. The bus stop will be used as staging area during construction.
- The island stops at Market Street and 5th Street will serve the F Market & Wharves streetcars only. Buses traveling to east and west will pick up and offload passengers at curbside next to the island stop at this location.
- Due to lane closures, slow traffic should be expected. All travelers, especially drivers, are encouraged to leave extra time and move carefully through the area.
