Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before an event ends and 45 minutes after an event ends.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, **NO PARKING** will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB) between Warriors Way and the 700 Block of TFB
- Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets

Taxi Stands

- Taxi Stands are located on Terry Francois Boulevard, one northbound and one southbound.
- Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way (formerly South Street) at Bridgeview Way.

<u>Fiesta on the Hill</u>

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: 3rd Street Transit and Safety Project

Saturday, October 26 and Sunday, October 27: Improvements to reduce bus delays and improve safety for people walking will continue for the 3rd Street Transit and Safety Project. Between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., crews are scheduled to repave the existing transit-only lane on 3rd Street between Harrison and Folsom streets and the east side parking lane at Bryant Street. From Harrison to Folsom streets, work includes grinding and paving the existing transit-only lane. From Bryant to Stillman streets, work includes grinding and laying new concrete. Parking spaces will temporarily be restricted in the construction zones during active work.

Customers should be aware that during construction the bus stop at Harrison Street will be temporarily relocated to Perry Street, half a block south, affecting the following lines:

- 8 Bayshore
- 30 Stockton
- 45 Union/Stockton

UPDATE: Townsend Corridor Improvement Project

Muni customers should be aware that as the construction begins next to the Caltrain station along the south side of Townsend Street, stops for the following lines will shift approximately 25 feet west (toward 5th Street) on that block:

- 10 Townsend
- 47 Van Ness
- 83X Mid-Market Express
- 30 Stockton (drop off only)
- 45 Union/Stockton (drop off only)

Please observe signs. For updated Muni routes visit <u>www.sfmta.com/townsend</u>.

Temporary passenger loading zones for private cars, ride hail, paratransit, private shuttles and other vehicles are now located on both sides of Townsend Street mid-block between 3rd and 4th streets. Taxi pick up and drop off is temporarily located on 4th Street at the entrance to the Caltrain Station.

Access for people walking, biking, and driving will be maintained during construction both at the Caltrain station and throughout the Townsend corridor. Signs on location will be regularly updated while crews work on the projects in sections throughout the corridor. Construction will generally occur between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday with some night and weekend work.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

On Friday, October 25, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to work on installing a joint-utility trench, sewer and water main installation and light pole installation at the following locations:

- Van Ness between Greenwich and Filbert streets
- Van Ness between Union and Green streets
- Van Ness between Green and Vallejo streets
- Van Ness between Vallejo and Broadway streets

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project continued

- Van Ness between Broadway and Pacific streets
- Van Ness between Pacific and Jackson streets
- Van Ness at Broadway Street
- Van Ness at Pacific Street
- Van Ness between Post and Geary streets
- Van Ness between Geary and O'Farrell streets
- Van Ness between O'Farrell and Ellis streets
- Van Ness between Ellis and Eddy streets
- Van Ness at McAllister and Market streets (intensive noise and vibration is expected)
- Van Ness at Market Street (disruptive noise is expected)

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Nighttime construction work will continue to take place between the hours of 5 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. and is anticipated to continue daily through January 2020.

Since July, crews have begun phase two of the rehabilitation work. Phase two construction work involves travel lane shifts and other adjustments to the roadway and work area. Vehicle and bicycle access via travel lanes across the bridge continue to be available in each direction, northbound and southbound (except during periods of full temporary bridge closures when the pending scope of work restricts access across the bridge for all vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic). Pedestrian access is available via the sidewalk along the eastern side of the bridge. People on bike may also choose to walk their bicycle along the pedestrian sidewalk as an alternative to riding across the bridge via the travel lane. Pedestrian access via the sidewalk along the western side of the bridge the western side of the bridge may be unavailable during different phases of upcoming work.

UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project continued

Third Street Bridge is open and access across the bridge is available. Please note, to complete remaining rehabilitation work, future short duration full bridge closures are anticipated to occur in late October or early November 2019. Closure details will be announced as soon as information is finalized.

Construction scheduling is subject to change due to rain or other weather delays, equipment breakdown, and/or unforeseen field conditions. Additional periods of short closures may be possible in September and October 2019, if necessary, to complete remaining rehabilitation work. Information will be shared closer to that period should additional closures seem necessary and details are finalized. Updates will be posted to the project webpage. UPDATE: L Taraval Improvement Project

Since Thursday, August 15, traffic pattern on lower Great Highway between Ulloa and Santiago streets has been changed. Northbound travel lane on lower Great Highway has been rerouted to 48th Avenue for two blocks between Ulloa and Santiago streets. Southbound travel lane will continue on lower Great Highway as usual. This will be in effect until project completion in 2022.

Monday, October 21 to Friday, November 8: Construction crew are performing sewer main replacement work on the northside of Taraval Street between 46th and 43rd avenues. Starting Wednesday, October 30, construction crew will also excavate small exploratory holes to verify the locations of existing underground utilities between 44th and 40th avenues. Work hours are from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Some parking spaces are temporarily restricted in the construction zones and traffic lanes have been modified in the northbound lane during active work.

NEW: Presidio National Park Tunnel Tops Project

Starting Monday, November 4 and will continue for two years to November 1, 2021, the Presidio Transit Center will be closed for work on the Tunnel Tops Project that will construct a park on top of Doyle Drive. The 43 Masonic Muni route as well as the Presidio Transit buses will be relocated to the temporary Presidio Transit Center at Anza and Lincoln boulevards. While no major street closures have been planned in the Castro/Noe/Mission areas, San Francisco police officers will monitor pedestrian and automobile traffic for any necessary public safety street closures.

Neighborhood trick-or-treat closures have been permitted on a number of streets around the City, particularly in the Taraval and Ingleside areas. Motorists should be attentive for street closures, slow down and be aware of children trick-or-treating throughout the City.
