Why Shotwell Street?

92% of residents who live on Shotwell Street support it being a Slow Street

57% of users rated their experience using Shotwell Slow Street as very positive

What is a Permanent Slow Street?



Time

- Traffic changes would extend beyond State of Emergency
- Authorization not tied to COVID emergency



Materials

- Part of the neighborhood's lasting infrastructure
- Part of the city's overall transportation network

How to Provide Feedback
