Formalizing customary perpendicular parking on portions of Innes Avenue, Rankin Street, and Kirkwood Avenue on the campus of the SF Market, and restricting evernight parking on those streets to address curb congestion and refuse accumulation (the SF Market is also working with SF Public Works to program street cleaning for these and other streets).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION / COMMENTS

The SF Market has requested parking and curb management measures to address safety and congestion issues on streets serving the SF Market campus. The SF Market has identified these street segments as the most problematic for congestion and dumping, and staff are recommending simple overnight restrictions to help keep the curb orderly and available for daytime market operations. The SF Market is also working with SF Public Works to program street cleaning for these and other streets presently without street cleaning. Additionally, formal designation of perpendicular orientation is recommended for the same segments which have long been parked perpendicular by custom.
