FAC Motion 160218.01

The CAC approves extending the T-line subway to North Beach and Fisherman's Wharf and supports inclusion of \$2 million of funding for the detailed planning and community outreach in the 2016-2017 SFMTA budget.

FAC Motion 160309.01

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA increase youth age to 18 from 17 similar to the Free Muni Program for Low and Moderate Income Youth.

FAC Motion 160309.02

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA establish discount fares for youth, seniors, at 50% of the adult fares.

FAC Motion 160309.03

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA establish a \$0.50 premium for riders paying cash to reduce cash payments and to encourage the use of the Clipper Card:

FAC Motion 160309.04

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA increase the commission paid to vendors from \$0.50 to \$0.75.

FAC Motion 160309.05

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA establish a premium fare for single rides on the express lines by increasing the adult rate by \$0.50 and the discount fares by \$0.25

FAC Motion 160309.06

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA establish a premium fare for single rides on the express lines by increasing the adult rate by \$1.00 and the discount fares by \$0.50

FAC Motion 160309.07

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA increase the "A" pass by \$5.00 above the indexed price.

FAC Motion 160309.08

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA provide a 50% discount to non-profit agencies that serve needy populations.

FAC Motion 160309.09

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA Board not lower the administrative fee for towed vehicles and not waive the fee for stored vehicles.

FAC Motion 160309.10

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA eliminate the 83x line.

FAC Motion 160309.11

To help address the FY17 and FY18 budget shortfall, further support the City's "Transit First" policy, allow for more efficient parking management and reduce carbon emissions, the SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA reinstate enforcement of parking meters on Sunday.

FAC Motion 160309.12

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA increase transit service hours by an additional 2% above the 10% increase already planned.

FAC Motion 160309.13

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA fund programs that will enhance transit performance including collision reduction, compliance with storage tank regulatory requirements, establish an independent quality assurance unit; fully staff the Transit Management Center, provide maintenance engineering and technical support to the Transit Services Division; hire dedicated transit PCOs and hire additional staff to reduce overtime.

FAC Motion 160309.14

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA provide additional funding for Vision Zero program education and outreach.

FAC Motion 160309.15

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA hire additional staff and purchase supplies to support Sustainable Streets' preventive maintenance program.

FAC Motion 160309.16

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA expend funds to support and enhance existing parking related applications and re-launch SF*park*.

FAC Motion 160309.17

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA provide funding to hire additional human resources analysts, safety specialists, storekeepers and outreach staff.

FAC Motion 160309.18

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA not provide funds to hire additional taxi investigators.

FAC Motion 160309.19

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA provide funds to hire additional security personnel.

FAC Motion 160309.20

The SFMTA CAC recommends that the SFMTA increase San Francisco's operating contribution to the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board.
