Director Tumlin shared about Bike and Roll to School Week, Earth Day, public transit ride along, upcoming Human Rights Commission hearing, Good People Tough Job Campaign, Supervisor Preston's resolution introduction asking state of CA to fund Bay Area public transit, Arguello Boulevard bike safety improvements, and Arab American & Middle Eastern Heritage Month Cable Car event.

Mark Gruberg expressed concern about the taxi medallion system not working for K medallion holders and urged the SFMTA to declare a moratorium on medallion suspensions.

Marcelo Fonseca shared about his experience while working as a taxi driver and urged the SFMTA to get rid of the driving requirement.

Luke Bornheimer urged the SFMTA to take fast action on streets and requested traffic diverters on Page Street be fixed.

Carl Macmurdo expressed concern for taxi medallion holders and the taxi airport policy.

Barry Taranto shared about attending a recent Interdepartmental Staff Committee on Traffic and Transportation (ISCOTT) meeting and urged the SFMTA to better enforce taxi stands at night.



Aleta Dupree shared about recently riding on Van Ness and using the escalators at Central Subway Stations.

Brian Trzcinski expressed concern about Vision Zero, that the SFMTA is prioritizing cars and parking over other considerations and reminded the SFMTA of the city's Transit First Policy.

Speaker requested that Director Yekutiel recuse himself from Item 11.

Speaker expressed concern about taxi medallions.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions:</u> Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
