

Streets Division Directive Order No. 6660

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Pursuant to the public hearing held on June 30, 2023, traffic movement and safety may be improved by the changes approved below.

1. <u>Balboa Street between 26th Avenue and 25th Avenue – Establishing a Commercial Loading</u> Zone (Yellow)

ESTABLISH – YELLOW ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 30-MINUTE LIMIT, 9AM to 5PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY

2449 Balboa Street, south side, from 26th Avenue to 35 feet east of 26th Avenue (35-foot zone), Richmond, Supervisor District 1, Color Curb Program, <u>ccp@sfmta.com</u>.

Per applicant request, establishes a commercial loading zone fronting business.

Public Comments: A resident spoke in opposition because this would impact parking and parking is limited and the Market occupied have not opened yet. Staff also received two emails from neighbors (one was the speaker at the hearing) regarding concerns over the loss of parking.

Decision: Staff revised this item to reduce the hours of the commercial loading zone from 6 pm to 5pm and removed the Saturday hours. Approved by the City Traffic Engineer for implementation.

2. <u>Fillmore Street between Lombard and Chestnut Street - Establishing a Passenger Loading</u> Zone (White)

3301 Fillmore Street, west side from 15 feet to 55 feet north of Lombard Street, at metered stall numbers 3303 and 3305 (40-foot zone), Marina, Supervisor District 2, Color Curb Program, <u>ccp@sfmta.com</u>.

Per applicant request, establishes a passenger loading zone on Fillmore after their previous zone on Lombard was removed to establish a Muni bus stop.

Public Comments: Applicant spoke in support of the proposed loading zone for pickup and drop-off as it is needed for children to be safely picked up and dropped off and to manage the number of vehicles that are attracted to the school. **Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer for implementation.

Whether or not the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, it is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If the City Traffic Engineer disapproves or declines a parking or traffic modification, a member of the public must request additional review by the SFMTA of that decision, which shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code before the decision becomes a Final SFMTA Decision. Final SFMTA Decisions, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Decisions reviewable by the Board of Supervisors are denoted with a pound (**#**).
