Minutes

1. Call to Order

- Susannah Raub called the meeting to order at 6:03 pm.

- Tom motioned to approve; Devi seconded. Minutes approved by unanimous consent at 6:19 p.m.

5. Public comment

- No public comment.

6. San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Project Update

- Derek Adams and Shalon Rogers presented this item.
- Tom Barton asked how the public will be notified when sidewalks are closed.
 - Derek Adams replied that PUC work would not be closing sidewalks.
 - Tom Barton recounted some places he had encountered closed sidewalks along Geary.
 - Derek Adams clarified that the contractor sometimes needs to temporarily relocate bus stops, but that these incidents would decline as work progressed. The contractor posts signage to make clear where customers should board instead.

- iv. Daniel Mackowski added that a crosswalk at Arguello was closed today. He explained that sometimes crosswalks needed to be closed temporarily to do work, but that these closures should be short.
- c. Cal Law asked if SFPUC's work would be complete by January 2027.
 - i. Derek Adams replied that most of the work will be done by then, but it won't be completely finished until spring 2027.

7. Geary Boulevard Improvement Project – Project update

- a. Liz presented this item.
- b. Susannah Raub asked how to engage with the Western Addition - Geary Boulevard Community Study.
 - i. Liz Brisson replied that the project's outreach dates aren't published yet and encouraged interested parties to visit the project website to sign up for email updates.
- c. Devi Zinzuvadia requested a link to sign up for email updates and asked which organizations were involved with the Western Addition – Geary Boulevard Community Study's Community Council.
 - i. Liz Brisson and Daniel Mackowski listed the organizations: Booker T Washington Community Center, New Community Leadership Foundation, Success Center, Congregation Sherith Israel, Jewish Community Relations Council, Japantown Task Force, KOHO, Buchanan YMCA

- d. Liz Brisson announced that SFMTA staff will be tabling at the next Richmond Night Market on July 18 to talk about upcoming surface construction work on Geary.
- e. Tom Barton asked when Geary will be repaved.
 - i. Liz Brisson replied that all repaving will be complete at the end of 2027 or beginning of 2028.
- f. Sean Kim asked if SFCTA's Westside Network Study was related to the Western Addition-Geary Boulevard Community Study.
 - i. Liz Brisson explained that they were not related. The Westside Network Study looks at the western side of San Francisco, starting at Stanyan, while the Western Addition-Geary Boulevard Community Study is focused around Geary Boulevard in the Western Addition, between Laguna and Divisadero.
- g. Andrei Svensson said that the Geary/19th Avenue Subway Study had just been published and requested a presentation at a future meeting.
