ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Call to Order

Chairman Nolan called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Roll Call

- 3. Announcement of prohibition of sound producing devices during the meeting.

Chairman Nolan announced that the ringing of and use of cell phones, pagers and similar soundproducing electronic devices are prohibited at the meeting. He advised that any person responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices might be removed from the meeting. He also advised that cell phones that are set on "vibrate" cause microphone interference and requested that they be placed in the "off" position.

-Special Recognition Award -Ongoing Activities Director Reiskin discussed the Chinese New Year Parade and "Free Muni" for seniors and people with disabilities.

8. Citizens' Advisory Council Report

Daniel Weaver, Chairman, Citizen's Advisory Council, presented the report.

9. Public Comment

Robert Cesana congratulated the Board for not dealing with the issues at all, just with the public. Polk Street can't take the traffic. The SFMTA is neglecting the taxi industry. Yellow Cab is cutting the amount of money being given to medallion holders which is jeopardizing the whole medallion program. The SFMTA has to do something soon or there won't be a taxi industry.

Hansu Kim stated that DeSoto cab is now going to be FlyWheel taxi. The industry has to recast itself in the eye of taxi consumers. Many consumers had no idea they could book a cab via an app. It was a big decision to give up the DeSoto brand but with new competition, they had to support new technology such as FlyWheel. This change was well received by the public and drivers.

Tone Lee wondered where the starting point is. At the end of the route, cab drivers need to make their destination. The medallion system needs to be reformed. Cab drivers should have their own medallions and cabs. They don't need cab companies to run their business because they can run it themselves. A lot of drivers are dumping the medallion and not buying it because they don't see the future in it.

Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B.
