#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION:**

Approving a parking and traffic modification to install bicycle lanes on Vicente Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

### **SUMMARY:**

- Vicente Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue is on Route 60 of the San Francisco Bicycle Network and currently demarcated with shared lane markings.
- This project will install bicycle lanes on Vicente Street between 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by the San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31.

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# PURPOSE

Approving a parking and traffic modification to install bicycle lanes on Vicente Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

# GOAL

This project supports San Francisco's Vision Zero by proposing engineering countermeasures that improve pedestrian and bicycle safety and connectivity. This project also supports the Bicycle Strategy, which calls for SFMTA to upgrade 50 miles of bicycle routes over the next five years.

This action supports the following SFMTA Strategic Plan Goals and Objectives:

- Goal 1: Create a safer transportation experience for everyone Objective 1.3: Improve the safety of the transportation system.
- Goal 2: Make transit, walking, bicycling, taxi, ridesharing and carsharing the preferred means of travel Objective 2.3: Increase use of all non-private auto modes.

# DESCRIPTION

Vicente Street is recognized on the San Francisco Bicycle Route Network as Route #60. This project improves a three block area within Route #60, the continuous east-west bicycle connection from the Outer Sunset to the Dogpatch neighborhood.

Separation of motor vehicles from bicycles can make a bicycle route safer and more appealing for bicyclists of all ages and abilities. The Vicente Bicycle Lanes project proposes to replace shared lane markings, which place motorists and bicyclists in the same physical space, with bicycle lanes. This section of Vicente Street is sufficiently wide to stripe bicycle lanes without any impacts to parking or traffic.

The street will be repaved in Fall 2015 and the proposed bike lanes will be immediately installed after the paving project.

The project requires the following parking and traffic modification:

A. ESTABLISH – BICYCLE LANES Vicente Street from 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue

#### **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

Fliers were posted on poles along the project corridor that briefly described the project and provided contacts for additional information. The fliers included instruction for language support. A public hearing was held on February 13, 2015, and no members of the public spoke in opposition to the project.

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### ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

A no-build option was considered that would maintain shared lane markings on Vicente Street. Due to the low cost and minimal impacts to parking and traffic, staff concluded that the recommendation to implement bicycle lanes is the best way to proceed.

### FUNDING IMPACT

The project is fully funded. The funding is comprised of the following sources:

2011 Streets Bond \$22,000

# ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

On June 3, 2015, the San Francisco Planning Department determined that the project was categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations section 15301 [Class 1(c) Minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities] and section 15304 [Class 4(h) Minor public alterations in the condition of land including the creation of bicycle lanes on existing rights-of-way].

The Planning Department's determination (Case number 2015-006976ENV) is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors. The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by the San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31.

WHEREAS, On June 3, 2015, the San Francisco Planning Department determined (Case No. 2015-006976ENV) the proposed parking and traffic modification listed above is categorically exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301 as a Class 1 (Existing Facilities) and Section 15304 as a Class 4 (Minor Alteration to Land) exemption; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Department's determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and is incorporated herein by reference; The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by the San Francisco Administrative Code, Chapter 31; and,

WHEREAS, The public has been notified about the proposed modifications and has been given the opportunity to comment on these modifications through the public hearing process; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors approves the parking and traffic modification listed above to install bicycle lanes on Vicente Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
