- Catalogue of the SFMTA's anticipated capital needs for the upcoming 20 years
- Financially unconstrained
- Identifies and prioritizes the agency's capital investment needs
- Strategic Planning & Policy leads process

## **Use of Prioritization Criteria**

- DOT/ET re-established capital planning prioritization criteria in 2013 to be aligned with Strategic Plan goals.
- Technical experts from each capital program prioritized projects using these criteria.
- TCC reviewed and approved priority recommendations.
- A project's priority score in the Capital Plan is one of many criteria considered when allocating funding.

## **Capital Plan Prioritization Process**

Step 1: DOT/ET determines capital plan prioritization criteria

- "How many points are possible?"
- Step 1a: Determine weight of each Strategic Plan goal
- Step 1b: Determine weight of criteria within each goal

#### Step 2:

Capital Program subcommittees rate projects

- "How many points does a project get?"
- Technical experts from each capital program rate each project on how well they meet the criteria

Step 3:

TCC reviews priority recommendations

- "Do ratings make sense?"
- TCC reviews and approves SFMTA Capital Plan
