# ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed parking and traffic modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301 provides an exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities.

The Planning Department has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Item A and Items E-M are exempt from CEQA (Planning Case Nos. 2016-015072ENV, 2017-002114ENV, 2017-004249ENV, 2017-003602ENV, 2017-002463ENV) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301. The proposed action is the Approval Action for Item A and Items E-N as defined by the S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.

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The Transit Center District Plan and Transit Tower Final Environmental Impact Report (TCDP FEIR) evaluated the environmental impacts of the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Items B-D. On May 24, 2012, the San Francisco Planning Commission in Motions 18628 and 18629 adopted the Transit Center District Plan (TCDP), certified its Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR), and adopted findings including a statement of overriding considerations and a mitigation monitoring and reporting program pursuant to CEQA. On September 7, 2012, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in Ordinance 185-12 adopted the Transit Center District Plan. On March 3, 2017, the Planning Department reviewed the proposed streetscape improvements described in Items B-D and determined that they are within the scope of the TCDP FEIR. No new significant effects have been identified, there is no substantial increase in significant effects already identified, and no new mitigation is required for the project. The SFMTA Board of Directors has subsequently reviewed the TCDP FEIR and CEQA Findings; the SFMTA Board of Directors adopts these findings as its own.

- D. ESTABLISH MIDBLOCK TRAFFIC SIGNAL Mission Street, at Shaw Alley.
- E. ESTABLISH RED ZONE Teresita Boulevard, west side, from 9 feet to 31 feet north of Marietta Drive (North) curb ramp.
