The Human Rights Commission has developed an equity framework for City departments; the aim is to provide tools and strategies that make City Government services more equitable for all.

The framework serves as an invitation for city departments to create and uphold transformational systems and approach actual and perceived limitations with innovation. We believe that city government has the ability to support resilient people and in partnership with communities can help develop foundations that uplift all.
