Residents of northwest Bernal Heights have petitioned the SFMTA to establish a new Residential Permit Parking (RPP) Area, which led to a community outreach process that started in spring 2015. The proposed RPP Area is comprised of those blocks where 50% or more of the addresses voted to create a new area; this voting process took place in May 2017. On July 7, 2017, the SFMTA held a public hearing to consider the proposal to establish a new RPP Area on these blocks. A second public hearing has been scheduled for November 17, 2017 to consider modifications to this proposal. The proposed block modifications are:

- Remove the 200-299 block of Esmeralda Avenue
- Add the 00-99 block of Prospect Avenue

These modifications are in response to resident requests. Since July 2017, a majority of residents on the 200 block of Esmeralda decided that they no longer support RPP on their block, while a majority of residents of the unit block of Prospect decided to support RPP.

The proposed RPP Area will have the following policies for the number of permits that may be issued per address:

- One permit per driver; two permits per address
- Permits for medical care and child care providers do not count towards the two per address limit
- Additional permits may be issued to an address if there is parking available in the immediate area and the permit is for additional licensed drivers in the household

Included with this notice are the SFMTA's requirements for obtaining a parking permit and answers to frequently asked questions. The current fee for a Residential Parking Permit is \$128. The fee for one-day permits is \$6 per permit for the first five permits, \$8 per permit for the 6th to 15th permit and \$11 per permit for the 16th to 20th permit (maximum 20 per year). The public hearing will be held at 10:00 AM on November 17, 2017 at City Hall, Room 416. The purpose of the public hearing is to solicit comment on the proposed new RPP Area. No decisions will be made at this meeting.
