Dreamforce Convention

Now through Saturday, September 29: A street closure of Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets is in effect for the Dreamforce Convention until 8 p.m., Saturday, September 29.

Tuesday, September 25 through Friday, September 28: The Salesforce Corporation is holding its yearly Dreamforce Convention at the Moscone Center. Conference hours are from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., each day. An attendance of 60,000 is expected to attend workshops and product demonstrations at Moscone Center North, South and West.

Significant traffic congestion is anticipated in and around Moscone Center between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily for the duration of the closure. Travelers are encouraged to take public transportation or use alternate routes. There are heavy pedestrian traffic in the area.

Howard Street traffic is being detoured via southbound 2nd Street to Harrison Street, or via New Montgomery Street to Hawthorne Street to either Folsom or Harrison streets.



Dreamforce Convention continued

There is signed bicycle detour for people on bikes on Howard Street to turn north at 2nd Street to Market Street. People on bikes who wish to stay on Howard Street have the option to dismount at Howard and 3rd streets and walk their bicycle through the event along the north sidewalk.

Signage is placed in advance of the street closures and detour routes.

Caltrans' electronic message signs are activated on major freeways entering the city to notify motorists of the closures.

SFMTA Parking Control Officers and San Francisco Police Officers are deployed at key intersections throughout the closures.

The following Muni routes are affected: 8 Bayshore; 8AX Bayshore A Express; 8BX Bayshore B Express; 10 Townsend; 12 Folsom; 14 Mission; 14R Mission Rapid; 14X Mission Express; 30 Stockton; 45 Union/Stockton; 81X Caltrain Express; and 82X Levi Plaza Express.

There are temporary taxi stands for *pick up and drop off only*:

- Eastside of Third Street (northbound) between Howard and Minna streets
- Southside of Howard Street (westbound) between 4th and 5th streets

Options for Buying Muni Tickets

Muni Ticket Sales - In Person

Muni customers may purchase their fare in advance, on-board vehicles and at any Muni ticket vending machine.

Muni customers transferring from BART may purchase round trip Muni transfer tickets at the Embarcadero Station two and a half hours prior to the start time of the concerts.

Transfers will be valid for up to two hours after the end of event.

Use of Clipper[®] Card

Event participants are encouraged to use Clipper[®] Card to get to AT&T Park. Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper[®] Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Golden Gate Ferry and Transit and San Francisco Bay Ferry provide the same discount on return trips.

Purchase Muni Fare using MuniMobile

Event participants may use <u>MuniMobile</u>, an official SFMTA app, to save time by instantly buying tickets for Muni bus, rail, cable car, and paratransit services on their iPhone and Android devices. Tickets can be purchased through a credit/debit card or PayPal account for individual or multiple riders on one smartphone. Customers can buy tickets ahead of time and activate when they are ready to ride - with MuniMobile, your phone is your fare.

Purchase Single Ride Muni Fare Electronically

Muni customers who purchase fares in advance using a Clipper[®] Card or use the official SFMTA app, <u>MuniMobile</u>, can save 25 cents per trip. A single ride fare on Muni is good for two hours of travel, whether it be on a single route or a trip with multiple transfers across buses and light rail.

In support of our military personnel, the SFMTA will offer free Muni Service (including Cable Car) to those in uniform or those who present military ID card during Fleet Week from Monday, October 1 through Monday, October 8.

The Blue Angels will have official shows on Friday, October 5, Saturday, October 6 and Sunday, October 7, from Noon to 4 p.m., each day.

From Friday through Sunday, the Parade of Ships, air shows and ship tours will be held to celebrate the U.S. Navy Fleet Week. These events will impact the Fisherman's Wharf area and the Marina District.

The celebration will begin on Friday at 10 a.m. with the Parade of Ships and continue on Saturday and Sunday from Noon to 4 p.m. Ship tours will be open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Friday through Monday. A crowd of over 300,000 is expected each weekend day.

Traffic coming into San Francisco is anticipated to be congested. Parking will be limited. BART, Ferries, AC Transit and SamTrans are alternate transportation options. The annual Italian Heritage Day Parade will also take place on Sunday, October 8. The parade will start at 12:30 p.m. at Jefferson and Powell streets. It is anticipated that traffic through the Fisherman's Wharf area will be congested.

Riders traveling via BART should transfer at the Embarcadero Station and take an F Market train or a bus to Fisherman's Wharf.



CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

NEW: Salesforce Transit Center Closure

Out of an abundance of caution, the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) decided to close the terminal temporarily. All bus routes have been rerouted to the temporary Transbay Center at Howard and Main streets: **The 5 Fulton, 5R Fulton Rapid, 7 Haight-Noriega, 25 Treasure Island, 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid are affected.** The closure is ongoing until further notice.

There are several traffic impacts due to the terminal closure and the closure of Fremont Street between Mission and Howard, particularly during peak commute hours. Motorists are kindly asked to avoid driving downtown and to avoid the Fremont exit of the freeway. Transit riders are encouraged to allow extra time for their commute.

Ambassadors will be on site to direct riders to boarding locations and provide updated transit information, so be on the lookout for our staff wearing neon vests if you need assistance. We will continue to provide service updates and other relevant information as it becomes available. Be sure to check our webpage, Twitter and 511.org for service updates.

NEW: Geary Rapid Project

Beginning Monday, October 1, the first set of transit and safety treatments will begin and is expected to take about four to six weeks to complete. These treatments will include:

- To improve bus service and reduce unpredictable delays, new transit-only lanes will be installed on most blocks between Stanyan and Gough streets:
 - To make room, one travel lane in each direction will be removed.
 - On-street parking will be removed on: the south side of Masonic to Presidio avenues; the north side of Steiner to Fillmore streets; and the south side of Fillmore to Webster streets.
- Several intersections will be "daylighted" by painting red curb at intersection corners to make people crossing the street more visible to drivers. Some parking space will be removed.
- Some locations will be painted as safety zone. This temporary treatment will provide a visual cue to motorists to slow down until pedestrian bulbs are installed.
- **New bicycle markings** to help cyclists to cross Geary Boulevard at Webster Street, Steiner Street and Masonic Avenue.
- On October 6, relocation or removal of bus stops will take effect at Masonic, Presidio, Fillmore, Webster and Hyde. The 38R Geary Rapid will discontinue service at Spruce Street stop.

Traffic may be affected by the construction work, motorists are advised to be cautious while driving on Geary and O'Farrell streets.

UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Now through January 2020: Crews will begin Phase Two of the Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project.

Since Monday, September 17, 2018, the bridge draw span has been lowered and locked in the down position. For a major part of the 15-month construction duration, the bridge will remain accessible to vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists. Over the course of the project, there will be some instances where a full short-term bridge closure will be required to gain access to areas underneath the bridge or to safely install scaffolding above the roadway.

Bridge rehabilitation work will begin the week of October 1. Traffic disruptions during general rehabilitation work should be expected to be less intrusive than full long-term bridge closures. Motorists are advised to plan and allow additional travel time or use alternate routes during the rehabilitation work to reach their destination. General work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

Traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue have been shifted to create two construction zones for upcoming utility work. Because some of this work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours.

Friday, October 5, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

• From Geary to O'Farrell streets: Crews are scheduled to work on updating the emergency firefighting water system. Disruptive noise is expected.

Neighbors are advised to anticipate construction-related noise as crews work diligently to complete necessary night work.

ONGOING: Bus Shuttles Substitute Powell-Mason Cable Car

Now through Saturday, September 29: To accommodate the Muni Cable Car Gearbox Rehabilitation Project, bus shuttles is substituting the Powell-Mason Line along the northern route from Powell to Washington streets to Taylor Street at Francisco Street. Bus service began since 10 p.m., Friday, September. 21 until the end of service on Saturday, September 29. Regular cable car service will resume at the start of service on Sunday, September 30.

Throughout the duration of bus substitution for cable car service:

- All other cable car lines operate as usual.
- Powell-Mason line customers traveling to the northern terminal at Francisco and Bay can ride Powell-Hyde Line and transfer to a bus at Powell and Washington streets to continue the rest of the trip.
- The bus shuttles follow the Mason Line and pick up passengers at the curb at cable car stops
- The terminal at Francisco and Bay streets are out of service. There is a temporary bus stop on Taylor, south of Francisco Street.
- Bus service are free for customers transferring to or from cable cars.
- Regular fare of \$7 applies on cable car.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in late 2018.

ONGOING: J Church Track Maintenance Project

Since Monday, September 17 and continue for about three weeks, J Church track maintenance work is taking place at the intersection of 23rd and Church streets. During construction, the J Church rail service will operate as normal. Church Street will remain open, eastbound and westbound lanes on 23rd Street may be closed occasionally and traffic approaching the intersection will be detoured.

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

During construction hours, 10 parking spaces **are be available** near the job site. Additional six parking spaces have been removed for staging 24 hours a day for the duration of the project.

ONGOING: Central Subway Project

Construction of the 4th and Brannan streets surface station platform is ongoing. Until further notice, traffic reroutes will remain in effect. Street restoration work has tentatively been scheduled to start on September 17 at the intersection of 4th and Brannan streets. This may affect traffic and pedestrian movement at the intersection. The work is scheduled to take place between 9 a.m. and 5 a.m. and may last several days.

Sewer replacement work continues Monday through Friday, from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. at 4th and Howard streets. Two through lanes are in place southbound 4th Street. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted.

One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street and sidewalk restoration work continues on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets, as well as on O'Farrell east of Stockton.



ONGOING: Central Subway Project continued

Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley is under a long-term temporary closure to vehicular traffic as station construction continues. Pedestrian access to Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley remains open. The pedestrian walkway scaffolding along the west side of Stockton Street south of Washington Street may be disassembled in the coming weeks, Pedestrian access through this area will be temporarily rerouted.

The Central Subway project is the first underground line to link the north and south corridors of the city, and will provide a direct connection to major retail, sporting and cultural venues while efficiently transporting people to jobs, educational opportunities and other amenities throughout San Francisco.
