WHAT IS THE PUBLIC ART PROGRAM?



Norie Sato, Air Over Under, 2011

In 1969, the City and County of San Francisco was one of the first municipalities in the country to enact an Art Enrichment Ordinance.

It requires that "2% of the gross estimated project cost" of civic capital projects be spent on artwork.

ARTWORK OPPORTUNTIES



- In compliance with Federal Transit Authority regulations, the art component for the stations must be integrated into the design of the stations.
- Desire for the artwork to help provide a unifying factor throughout the system, or to help distinguish the high profile stations.
- The art program may address design features integrated into all the platforms, or focus attention on the Market, McAllister, and Geary street stations.

Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard Transit Plan



- Development is providing resources to enhance Muni service
- New & extended Muni routes will provide access to development sites
- SFMTA wants to ensure routes benefit existing neighborhoods as well

Geneva-Harney Bus Rapid Transit



Phased approach

Western Segment: Muni Forward Central Segment: Geneva-Harney BRT Project Eastern Segment: FivePoint (Candlestick/HP)



SFMTA Project Goals

Connect Muni to New Development: Provide transit service for Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard, India Basin, Executive Park, and others

Service Equity: Use transit resources provided by new developments to better meet the needs of existing neighborhoods

Fall 2017 Outreach Results

- During 2017 Equity Strategy outreach, we asked Southeast SF residents where they go on Muni
- Examples of events we attended: Wu Yee, Resilient Bayview, Backpack Giveaways
- Surveys also distributed via mailing list (SurveyGizmo) and bus stop postings (Textizen)
- 1,664 destinations submitted

Fall 2018 Survey

- Bus route ideas developed using community feedback from Fall 2017 survey
- Attended community events Mid-summer through Fall 2018
- Online version available through February
- Results will be used to develop a new transit plan for Candlestick Point/Hunters Point Shipyard
- Service planned to be implemented as development phases come online


Recap / Next Steps

- Travel and development patterns have changed over time
- Current Candlestick Point-Hunters Point Shipyard transit service plan is no longer aligned with riders' destinations
- SFMTA has several proposed adjustments, and is seeking community input this summer
- Recommended adjustments ready for community review in early 2019

- 1,500-1,750 Peak Hour traffic volume
- Local and downtown express buses
- Bike/ped access to Caltrain
- Ongoing Recology use
- Planned Brisbane Baylands project

Construction update

- Construction is approximately at 27% completion
- Joint trenching ongoing
- Addressing utility conflicts
- Sewer installation intensive night work
- Sidewalk replacement work outreach to affected blocks ongoing
- SFPD nighttime foot patrols and increased enforcement of construction zones
