- **Friday, April 12:** Parking passes will be accepted, but there will be **limited parking** available in Lot A and Pier 48 for those wishing to purchase parking on the day of game by cash or credit payment.

# **Cherry Blossom Festival**

**Saturday, April 13 and Sunday, April 14:** The 52<sup>nd</sup>.Annual Cherry Blossom Festival will be held for two consecutive weekends, April 13-14 and April 20-21. The festival will take place from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., each day. For event details visit www.sfcherryblossom.org.

There will also be a parade on Sunday, April 21. The parade will begin at Civic Center at 1 p.m., proceeding up Polk to Post Street, and ending in Japantown at Post and Fillmore streets.

The following street closures will be required beginning 4 a.m., Saturday through 11 p.m., Sunday:

- Post Street between Laguna and Fillmore streets
- Webster Street between Geary Boulevard and Sutter Street
- Buchanan Street between Bush and Sutter streets
- Intersection: Webster Street at Post Street

There will be no impact on Muni service.

**Special Event Parking** will be hosted at the Fillmore Street Annex Garage at 1650 Fillmore Street. A \$25 flat-rate event parking fee will be charged for valet-assisted parking. Operating hour of garage will be from 9 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. for each of the four weekend days for the festival: Saturday, April 13; Sunday, April 14; Saturday, April 20 and Sunday, April 21. Only event parking will be available at the annex garage on these four days. There will be no hourly parking and in-and-out privileges will not be allowed. Hourly parking will be available at the Japan Center Main Garage at 1650 Geary Boulevard on a first-come, first-served basis.

# **Cesar Chavez Parade and Festival**

**Saturday, April 13:** The annual Cesar Chavez Parade will begin at 11 a.m. Participants will gather at 19<sup>th</sup> Street between Dolores and Guerrero streets at 10 a.m. The festival will be held after the parade on 24<sup>th</sup> Street between Treat and Bryant streets from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. For details visit 2019 Cesar Chavez Day.

The parade will proceed from Dolores and 19<sup>th</sup> streets, east on 19<sup>th</sup> Street, south on Mission Street, east on 24<sup>th</sup> Street to Folsom Street. The festival area will take place on 24<sup>th</sup> Street between Treat and Bryant streets.

Streets will re-open as the parade passes. The following closures will be required from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.:

- 24<sup>th</sup> Street between Treat and Bryant streets
- Harrison between 23<sup>rd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> streets
- Intersections: 24<sup>th</sup> Street at Harrison, Alabama, Florida streets

Local residential access will be allowed on Florida and Alabama streets.

The following Muni routes will be affected: 12 Folsom/Pacific; 14 Mission; 14R Mission Rapid; 27 Bryant; 48 Quintara/24<sup>th</sup> Street; 49 Van Ness/Mission; and 67 Bernal Heights.

#### <u>Sunday Streets – Tenderloin</u>

**Sunday, April 14:** The third Sunday Streets event will take place in the Civic Center and Tenderloin neighborhoods. This event route travels along Fulton Street, Ellis Street, Golden Gate Avenue, Jones, Turk and Larkin streets. The route will be available for recreational activities from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The event is free to all participants. The following street closures will be required from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- Jones Street between O'Farrell Street and Golden Gate Avenue
- Larkin Street between Grove and O'Farrell Streets
- Fulton Street between Larkin and Hyde streets
- Ellis Street between Larkin and Taylor streets
- Golden Gate Avenue between Polk and Jones streets



# <u>Sunday Streets – Tenderloin continued</u>

Cross traffic will be allowed at the following locations:

- Eastbound on McAllister Street
- East and westbound on Eddy Street at Larkin and Leavenworth streets
- Northbound on Leavenworth Street

Traffic will be controlled by Parking Control officers and San Francisco police officers.

The following Muni routes will be affected: 5 Fulton; 19 Polk; 27 Bryant and 31 Balboa.

#### **CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES**

#### NEW: 30 and 45 Muni Routes Return to Lower Stockton and 4th streets

**Beginning Saturday, April 13**, the **30 Stockton** and **45 Union/Stockton** Muni routes will return to Stockton Street between Geary and Ellis streets and continue down 4<sup>th</sup> Street. The **30 Stockton** and **45 Union/Stockton** were rerouted approximately seven years ago to Sutter, Mason and 5<sup>th</sup> streets in order to make way for Central Subway near Union Square. These two routes are returning to their original routes in advance of the completion of Central Subway that is on target for revenue service at the end of 2019. This change follows the successful return of the **8 Bayshore and 91 OWL** routes to Stockton and 4<sup>th</sup> streets in February when Stockton Street was reopened to traffic as a key milestone in the completion of Central Subway. # NEW: Inner Sunset Streetscape Improvement Project continued

Saturday, April 13: To accommodate the final phase of the Inner Sunset Streetscape Improvement Project, Muni will run bus shuttles for the N Judah Line between Ocean Beach and Carl and Cole streets starting Saturday, April 13 and will continue for approximately two weeks. Bus substitution is required in order to complete paving work on Irving Street between Arguello Boulevard and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

Regular N Judah rail service will operate between 4<sup>th</sup> and King streets and Carl Street and Hillway Avenue. Carl Street and Hillway Avenue will be the last stop served by N Judah rail service. For stops west of Carl Street and Hillway Avenue, customers must transfer at Carl and Cole streets to continue their trip. Carl and Cole will be the last accessible rail stop.

Bus service will begin at 4:30 a.m., Saturday, April 13 and will continue during regular service hours until construction is completed. Bus shuttles will follow the regular N Judah line except for short segments along Frederick Street and Lincoln Way.

Customers traveling downtown are encouraged to allow extra travel time for their trips or consider taking alternate Muni routes, such as NX Judah Express, 6 Haight/Parnassus, 7 Haight/Noriega and 7X Noriega Express. Customers in the Inner Sunset area can also take the 43 Masonic or 44 O'Shaughnessy line to Forest Hill Station and transfer to Muni Metro lines for downtown travel. The L Taraval service is also available to connect downtown and the Sunset District

Due to the ongoing need for additional bus operators during this time, Muni riders may experience additional gaps and crowding on the Chestnut, Geary and Mission corridors. The E Embarcadero and 83X Mid-Market Express lines will also be suspended until construction is completed. Alternate service will be provided by the F Market & Wharves and the N Judah trains:

- Along The Embarcadero, north of Market Street, use the <u>F Market & Wharves</u> historic streetcar.
- Along King Street and The Embarcadero, south of Market Street, use the N Judah train.
- Transfer between the N and F trains at Embarcadero Station and the Ferry Building.



# **UPDATE: Central Subway Project**

Repaving work at the intersection of 4<sup>th</sup> and Bryant streets is currently scheduled to start on Wednesday, April 17 This work will begin at 7 a.m. and will continue 24 hours a day through Sunday, April 21. Temporary lane closures may be in effect during the duration of this work. At 4<sup>th</sup> and Howard streets, utility upgrade work is ongoing, Monday through Friday, overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted. Work to repave this intersection is currently scheduled to occur on Saturday, April 13 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., weather permitting. Temporary lane closures may occur through the duration of this work. In Chinatown, the sidewalk on the west side of Stockton Street, south of Washington Street, adjacent to the worksite is temporarily closed to facilitate utility upgrade work. There is currently one lane of traffic open on both sides of Stockton between Clay and Jackson. # **UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project**

**On Friday, April 12,** between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to work on street light conduits and water main installation at the following locations:

- Van Ness at Clay Street
- Van Ness at Sacramento Street
- Van Ness at California Street
- Van Ness at Pine Street
- Van Ness at Bush Street
- Van Ness at McAllister Street
- Van Ness at Hayes Street
- Van Ness between Fell and Market streets
- Van Ness at Mission Street

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. # **ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project**

The T Third line resumed rail service since Monday, April 1. Train is running, but the Muni platform at UCSF Mission Bay will remain out of service through late April 2019. The T Third train continue to operate but will skip that stop. Customers should board at Mission Rock and Mariposa stations.

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' arena, the SFMTA is constructing a new 320-foot center platform along 3<sup>rd</sup> Street between South and 16<sup>th</sup> streets. The existing platform will be demolished. The new track alignment will include one single and one double crossover to facilitate the movement of vehicles as operations requires. Other associated work includes modification of the overhead contact system, and both above and below ground utility relocation work. Construction will require four phases that will necessitate three separate transit service plans. # **ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop**

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in summer 2019. Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

A partial street closure is currently in effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> streets through summer of 2019. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.

# ONGOING: Muni Metro Elevator Safety Modernization Project continued

While the elevator is out of service, customer can use the following options to access Church Station:

- Take an inbound train for L Taraval, M Ocean View, K Ingleside/T Third Streets lines or S Shuttle Customers can exit at Van Ness Station, proceed to the outbound platform and take any L, M, K/T or S lines to Church Station.
- **Heading inbound from Church Station** Customers can use the outbound elevator to access any outbound train, get off at Castro Station, proceed to inbound platform and take any inbound train to continue travel.
- Accessible service to the Church and Market area is available on the following Muni routes or lines:
  - J Church (Accessible stops at Duboce and Church as well as inbound at Church at Market)
  - o N Judah (Accessible stop at Duboce and Church)
  - o F Market & Wharves (serves Church, Van Ness and Castro stations)
  - o 37 Corbett (serves Church and Castro stations)
- Customers with disabilities can use station escalators to access the inbound platform.

Upon completion of this upgrade work at Church Station, the SFMTA will begin work on elevators at Castro and Forest Hill stations. The entire upgrade project is expected to take about four years to complete.
