Muni Service at New Transbay Transit Center

Saturday, July 13: Following the reopening, Muni will resume service to the Transbay Transit Center on routes 5 Fulton, 5R Fulton Rapid, 7 Haight/Noriega, 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid.

Customers who travel to the temporary Transbay Terminal for the 25 Treasure Island route, AC Transit/WestCAT, Greyhound, Bolt or AMTRAK will need to cross between the bus plaza and Beale Street.

The remaining services at the temporary Transbay Terminal are scheduled to return to the Transit Center later this summer.

Across the Bay 12K

Sunday, July 14: The Across the Bay 12K & 5K run, a footrace benefiting the Edgewood Children Center, will begin at 7:30 a.m. and travel from East Fort Baker in Marin County to Aquatic Park. For more event details, please visit <u>http://race415.com/</u>.

Runners will leave East Fort Baker, run over the Golden Gate Bridge via the west walkway, exit walkway into Golden Gate Bridge Maintenance Yard using roadway to Lincoln Boulevard, then proceed east on Battery East Road bicycle route and pedestrian pathway to Long Avenue. After looping around Fort Mason, runners will proceed along the Golden Gate Promenade, out the Marina Gate to Marina Boulevard, then through Fort Mason to Aquatic Park.

The following street closures will be required:

From 4 a.m., Saturday, to 3 p.m., Sunday

• Beach Street between Polk Street to Westerly Terminus

From 11:59 p.m., Saturday to 1 p.m., Sunday

• Van Ness Avenue between the Muni turn-round and Northerly Terminus

From 6:30 to 11 a.m., Sunday*

• Westbound Marina Boulevard between Marina Gate at Lyon Street and Laguna Street

Note:

* There will be a lane shift on Marina Boulevard to accommodate both eastbound and westbound traffic

The following Muni routes will be affected: **19 Polk and 28 19th Avenue**.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: Muni Track Work at Judah Street & 17th Avenue

Beginning Monday, July 8, for about four weeks, N Judah track maintenance work is taking place at Judah Street and 18th Avenue. During construction, the N Judah rail service is operating without interruption. While Judah Street remains open, vehicular traffic along 18th Avenue is temporarily for "right turn only" until work completed.

UPDATE: Muni Track Work at Judah Street & 17th Avenue continued

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. During construction:

- While measures are being taken to minimize inconvenience, neighbors can expect some noise during demolition.
- To accommodate the construction, four parking spaces, two on each side of Judah Street east of the intersection, has been used as staging areas. They are unavailable for parking 24 hours a day for the duration. Additionally two or three parking spaces on the remaining sides of the street are unavailable during construction hours.
- Crosswalks and sidewalks may be occasionally closed.
- Due to lane closures, slow traffic is expected. All travelers, especially drivers, are encouraged to leave extra time and move carefully through the area.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

On Friday, July 12, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to conduct water main replacement, street light conduit and potholing work at the following locations:

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project continued

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Third Street Bridge rehabilitation project night work **started on Monday, June 24**. Crews began working a second shift at night after general work hours. Construction work is taking place between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Night work is anticipated to continue nightly, Monday through Saturday, **through 7 a.m., Friday October 4**.

Crews will soon transition into phase two of rehabilitation activity started on Sunday, July 7. Transition into phase two involves travel lane shifts and other adjustments to the roadway and work area. Vehicle and bicycle access via travel lanes across the bridge continue to be available in each direction, northbound and southbound **(except during periods of full temporary bridge closures when the pending scope of work restricts access across the bridge for all vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic)**. Pedestrian access are available via the sidewalk along the eastern side of the bridge. Bicycles may also choose to walk their bicycle along the pedestrian sidewalk as an alternative to riding across the bridge via the travel lane. Pedestrian access via the sidewalk along the western side of the bridge may be unavailable during different phases of upcoming work.

Road Closures

Now until next Wednesday, July 17: To facilitate ongoing rehabilitation activity, a temporary full closure of the bridge are being implemented. All vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic are restricted. Full temporary bridge closures are only anticipated to be in effect between the following dates:

- Thursday, July 25 to Friday, August 2
- Thursday, August 15 to Friday, August 23, 2019



UPDATE: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project continued

Construction scheduling is subject to change due to rain or other weather delays, equipment breakdown, and/or unforeseen field conditions. Additional periods of short closures may be possible in September and October 2019, if necessary, to complete remaining rehabilitation work. Information will be shared closer to that period should additional closures seem necessary and details are finalized. Updates will be posted to the project webpage.

UPDATE: Central Subway Project

Pavement renovation work may commence at the intersection of 4th and King streets beginning Thursday, July 25. This work will continue until early August and will be conducted between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. every day until completion. Temporary detours may occur for vehicular and pedestrian traffic through the intersection and traffic lanes may be reduced. In Chinatown, the sidewalk on the west side of Stockton Street, south of Washington Street, adjacent to the worksite is temporarily closed to facilitate utility upgrade work. There is currently one lane of traffic open on both sides of Stockton between Clay and Jackson streets. ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' arena, the SFMTA is constructing a new 320foot center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. The existing platform has been demolished. The new track alignment will include one single and one double crossover to facilitate the movement of vehicles as operations requires. Other associated work includes modification of the overhead contact system, and both above and below ground utility relocation work. ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in summer 2019. Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

A partial street closure is currently in effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18th and 19th streets through summer of 2019. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.

L Taraval Improvement Project

The L Taraval Improvement Project will start construction in summer of 2019 to realize permanent and comprehensive safety components, along with repair and rehabilitation of aging sewer and water lines, worn rails, overhead wires, and roadways. The project will be in two phases/segments:

- Phase One of the project will focus on the streets from SF Zoo to Sunset Blvd (Segment A)
- Phase Two of the project will continue from Sunset Blvd to West Portal (Segment B)
- Planned for Spring 2020, train services will be temporarily substituted with bus shuttles during construction
- The duration of the project is approximately 3 years
