A LOOK AT THE VAN NESS PROJECT

Major upgrades are underway on Van Ness Avenue. This massive civic improvement project is bringing San Francisco its first Bus Rapid Transit system, a much-needed and globallyproven solution to improve transit service and address traffic congestion on Van Ness Avenue, a major north-south arterial. To maximize the benefits during construction, the project also includes extensive utility maintenance, civic improvements, and safety enhancements that will revitalize this historic corridor

Construction is expected to last through 2021.
