- Completion of South Van Ness Ave. and Mission St. intersection.

Beginning tomorrow moming, Wednesday, August 4, at 6 a.m., the B. Van Ness Avenue and Mission Street Intersection is scheduled to be closed for five days, expected to reopen at 6 a.m. on Mondy, August 9. By closing the ful Intersection for five days, the team can complete work in the Intersection that would normally regular low months of work completed more segment at a Imme. The goal is to intrinsize incorrentements for the public. This closure will impact people driving, taking transit and waiking in BoMa, Tenderloin, Civic Center, Harves Valter, Deventement and Imme Mission.

People who travel in the area are encouraged to "Soout Your Routs" before the shutdown and plan their travel accordingly. The <u>project website</u> details the available detours and provides additional information for motorists. While pedestrian access will be mainfained at all times, people waking should consider bypassing the area.

Muni routes 14 Mission, 14R Mission Rapid, 49 Van Neze-Mission, 90 San Bruno Cwi and 91 3rd-19th Ave Cwi and AC Transit Route 800 will be rerouted and some bus stops will be relocated. Muni Metro and BART service will not be atticeted.

Geary Rapid Project

As part of the <u>Geary Rapid Project</u>, work to replace aging water lines continues east of Van Ness Avenue. Surface improvements are also underway throughout the corridor, including upgraded traffic signals and streetlights, sidewalk extensions at bus stops and intersection corners, improved median refuges and red transit lane treatments.

Expected wrap-up of project is on time and on budget.

Neighboring Project Updates

Caltrans Lombard Street Daytime Lane Closures

Following the Lombard Vision Zero Project, Caltrans recently completed roadway improvements on the US 101/Richardson-Lombard corridor between Francisco Street and Van Ness Avenue. This included repaying the roadway, restriping the lanes and crosswalk and upgrading curb ramps. The SFMTA Board of Directors recently approved High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes to be added on the corridor. MTA received an encroachment permit to implement the HOV lanes last week and implementation of the lanes is estimated for late September.
