# **JONES STREET QUICK-BUILD PROJECT** FALL 2021 UPDATE

Jones Streets from O'Farrell Street to Golden Gate Avenue has undergone various changes over the past 18 months in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. SFMTA added temporary walking space in August 2020 to allow people to practice physical distancing for essential travel and services. This change converted one car travel lane and parking lane to a pedestrian walking space.

As of October 1<sup>st</sup> 2021, the physical distancing lanes were removed along Jones in partnership with City's Heathy Streets Operation Center (HSOC) in response to guality of life concerns while still maintaining the road diet from three to two lanes.

## **43% OF COLLISIONS ON JONES INVOLVED THESE FACTORS:**







Lane Changing

Failure to Yield

Jones Street is on the City's High Injury Network, the 13% of city streets that account for 75% of severe and fatal collisions.

Rear Ends

In the last five years, there were **62** collisions on Jones Street O'Farrell Street to Golden Gate Avenue, resulting in **four** severe injuries and **one** fatality.
