San Francisco—The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) releases the following upcoming event-related traffic and transit impacts for the week from Thursday, July 17 through Wednesday, July 23, 2025.

Castro Night Market

Friday, July 18: The Castro Night Market will take place from 5 to 9 p.m. on 18th and Castro streets. For more details, visit [castro-night-market](#).

The following street and parking lot closures will be required from noon to midnight, Friday:

- 18th Street between Collingwood and Hartford streets
- The SFMTA parking lot behind Walgreens

The 33 Ashbury/18th Street Muni route will be affected.

Event at Chase Center

Friday, July 18 through Tuesday, July 22: Two concert performances will be held at the Chase Center:

- **Friday, July 18:** Performance by [Katy Perry](#) will take place. The concert will start at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 6 p.m.
- **Tuesday, July 22:** Performance by [Lady Gaga](#) will take place. The concert will start at 8 p.m. Doors will open at 7 p.m.

Supplemental Muni Service

- Muni will operate supplemental 78X Arena Express service.
- *Pre-event express shuttle service* from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other area major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after an event.
- Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, NO PARKING will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.

Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

Concert at the Ballpark

Saturday, July 19: Concert performance by the rock band, [My Chemical Romance](#), will take place at the ballpark. The concert will start at 6 p.m. and will end at approximately 11 p.m.

Street Closures

To accommodate the event, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Beginning at around 9 p.m., the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 2nd and 3rd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-concert period.
- Southbound 2nd Street at Townsend Street will be temporary closed when concert ends, only Taxis and emergency vehicles will be allowed through the closure.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, west side, north of King Street

Special Event Parking Rates

From 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Valencia Street between Duboce Avenue and 26th Street will be closed to all vehicular traffic. Local access will be allowed.

Cross traffic at Valencia Street will be allowed on:

- 14th Street
- 16th Street
- 18th Street
- 24th Street
- 26th Street
- Duboce Avenue

The following Muni routes will be affected: **27 Bryant and 55 16th Street.**

Muni Fare Increases Effective July 1, 2025

On Tuesday, July 1, some Muni fares increased, based on public feedback received during our budget process in spring 2024. For details about all fares, visit [SFMTA.com/Fares](https://www.sfmta.com/fares).

On Tuesday, July 1, the Clipper and MuniMobile discount was reduced from 25 cents to 15 cents, bringing the fare to \$2.85. This change helps offset rising costs while minimizing the impact on riders. The cash fare will remain at \$3. The cable car fare increased for the first time since January 2020, from \$8 to \$9.

After feedback collected from the public, these fare adjustments were included as part of the SFMTA's 2024-2026 budget, which began on July 1, 2024. For more information, visit our [Fares webpage](#) or call 311.

ONGOING: Cable Car Sheaves Upgrade Project

Since Tuesday, Feb. 18, crews have been working to restore the cable car system sheaves, which are massive, grooved wheels that guide the underground cables through specialized pulley systems.

These upgrades will continue through Sept. 2025. During this work:

- there will be occasional closures of individual cable car segments;
- bus shuttles will replace cable car lines where work is being done;
- at least one cable car route will remain open to the public during normal operating hours while sections are being upgraded.
