San Francisco—The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) releases the following upcoming event-related traffic and transit impacts for this week from Thursday, Sept. 4 through Wednesday, Sept. 10, 2025.

Downtown First Thursdays

Thursday, Sept. 4: The Downtown First Thursdays (DFT) event will take place on 2nd Street from 5 to 10 p.m. This is a free monthly street party that takes place every first Thursday of the month. For event details, visit www.dftsf.com.

The following street closures will be required from noon until midnight, Thursday:

- 2nd Street between Market and Folsom streets
- Clementina Street between 2nd and 1st streets
- Jessie Street between New Montgomery and 2nd streets
- Minna Street between New Montgomery and 1st streets
- Natoma Street between New Montgomery and 1st streets
- Stevenson Street between New Montgomery and 1st streets
- Tehama Street between Hawthorne and 1st streets

These intersections will remain open at all times: 1) 2nd and Mission streets; **2)** 2nd and Howard streets.

There will be no impact on Muni service.

Event at Chase Center

Thursday, Sept. 4 through Saturday, Sept. 6: There will be multiple events to be held at the Chase Center:

- **Thursday, Sept. 4:** The Golden State Valkyries will play against the [Dallas Wings](#) at the Chase Center. The game will start at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m.
- **Saturday, Sept. 6:** The Golden State Valkyries will play against the [Minnesota Lynx](#) at the Chase Center. The game will start at 5:30 p.m. Doors will open at 4 p.m.

Supplemental Muni Service

- Muni will operate supplemental 78X Arena Express service.
- *Pre-event express shuttle service* from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other area major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after the event.
- Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, NO PARKING will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.

Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

Haight Ashbury Street Fair

Sunday, Sept. 7: The 46th annual Haight Ashbury Street Fair will take place in the Haight-Ashbury District. The event will be held from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. For event details, visit [Haight Ashbury Street Fair](#).

The following street closures will be required from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Sunday:

- Haight Street between Masonic and Stanyan streets
- Ashbury Street between Page and Waller streets
- Clayton Street between Page and Waller streets
- Cole Street between Page and Waller streets
- Belvedere Street between Page and Waller streets
- Shrader Street between Page and Waller streets
- Intersections: Ashbury, Clayton, Shrader, Cole and Belvedere at Haight Street

The following Muni line and routes will be affected: **N Judah Bus (Sunday early morning buses only); 7 Haight/Noriega; 33 Ashbury/18th; 37 Corbett and 43 Masonic.**

Event participants are encouraged to take public transportation to the event as street parking will be severely limited in the area. Monitored bicycle parking will be available on Ashbury Street between Waller and Haight streets.

San Francisco Giants Baseball Game

Monday, Sept. 8 through Wednesday, Sept. 10: The San Francisco Giants will play three games at the ballpark. Listed below are the start time for these games:

- **Three games against the Arizona Diamondbacks: 1)** 6:45 p.m., Monday, Sept. 8; **2)** 6:45 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 9; and **3)** 12:45 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 10.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic. King Street will reopen after the first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, west side, north of King Street

Special Event Parking Rates

During baseball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the ballpark, **parking meters close to the ballpark will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour.** These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the ballpark, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

NEW: Repaving 20th Avenue from Buckingham Way South through Winston Drive Intersection

Tuesday, Sept. 9 through Friday, Sept. 12: Stonestown will be repaving 20th Avenue from the south end of Buckingham Drive to just north of Winston Drive over four days. Construction hours are from 4 a.m. until 4 p.m. daily. During this work:

- The following Muni routes will be re-routed: **1)** 18 46th Avenue; **2)** 57 Parkmerced; and **3)** 58 Lake Merced
- The 29 Sunset will experience some delays through the area of Winston Drive and 20th Avenue

NEW: Sewer Replacement and Street Reconstruction in the Wharf Area

Now through Mid-October: As part of this work, bus stops will be relocated and some bus lines will be rerouted. The work area is Powell Street between Jefferson and North Point streets, and, on North Point Street between Mason and Powell streets. The following Muni routes will be impacted by the construction work:

- The 39 Coit: Some stops will be relocated
- The 28 19th Avenue has been rerouted in the area due to work impacts at the terminal

NEW: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements

Now until 2027: Replacement work of sewer and water lines is currently taking place along Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street.

Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated. This coming week, temporary bus stop relocations include inbound stops at 20th Avenue, Park Presidio and 9th Avenue.

ONGOING: Cable Car Sheaves Upgrade Project

Since Tuesday, Feb. 18, crews have been working to restore the cable car system sheaves, which are massive, grooved wheels that guide the underground cables through specialized pulley systems.

These upgrades will continue through Sept. 2025. During this work:

- there will be occasional closures of individual cable car segments;
- bus shuttles will replace cable car lines where work is being done;
- at least one cable car route will remain open to the public during normal operating hours while sections are being upgraded.

ONGOING: Supporting Trips to School and Work: Muni Service Changes Started on Aug. 30, 2025

The SFMTA is changing Muni service on a few routes later this month to make it even easier to get to school and work in the morning. These changes are based on direct feedback from riders and operators. These changes aim to improve your Muni experience. They address weekday crowding on routes used by students, express service for downtown commuters and connections to regional transit is expanding.

Weekday changes begin Tuesday, Sept. 2. The SFMTA is reallocating resources without raising costs. That means the SFMTA is making Muni schedules more efficient while saving money. Here's what's changing and why:

Starting Tuesday, Sept. 2, the 7:15 a.m. and 7:45 a.m. trips will return to the 1X California Express. The 30X Marina Express will also add a new morning run at 8:15 a.m. If you ride the 49 Van Ness-Mission, there will be more buses during the busiest part of the morning. Schedules will be adjusted to improve the 8 Bayshore and 29 Sunset in the evening peak. This is because students rely on the 8 Bayshore, 29 Sunset and 49 Van Ness/Mission for their trips to school.

There will also be a few Muni stop changes based on feedback and ongoing construction. These updates will not cost more. The SFMTA is just reallocating existing resources to where they are needed most.
