Workday Rising 2025

Friday, Sept 12 through Saturday, Sept. 20: To support the Workday Rising conference to take place beginning on Monday, Sept. 15, a street closure of Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets will be required from 12:01 a.m., Friday, Sept. 12 to 4 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 20. There will be additional closures of curb lanes only in the vicinity of Moscone Center

Monday, Sept 15 through Thursday, Sept. 18: The Workday Rising Conference will take place at Moscone Center.

Chinatown Night Market

Friday, Sept. 12: The monthly night market will take place in Chinatown. This is an event that takes place **on the second Friday of each month, from 5:30 to 9 p.m.**

The following street closures will be required from 1 to 11:59 p.m., Friday, Sept. 12:

- Grant Avenue between California and Pacific streets
- Waverly Plaza between Washington and Sacramento streets
- Commercial Street between Grant Avenue and Kearny Street

All other intersections will remain open.

There will be no impact on Muni service.

San Francisco Giants Baseball Game

Friday, Sept. 12 through Sunday, Sept. 14: The San Francisco Giants will play three games at the ballpark. Listed below are the start time for these games:

- **Three games against the Los Angeles Dodgers: 1)** 7:15 p.m., Friday, Sept. 12; **2)** 6:05 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 13; and **3)** 1:05 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 14.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic. King Street will reopen after the first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, west side, north of King Street

Special Event Parking Rates

During baseball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the ballpark, **parking meters close to the ballpark will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour.** These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the ballpark, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

NEW: I-280 Ramp Closures for Caltrans Project

Wednesday, Sept. 10 through Saturday, Sept. 13: To facilitate various construction work for Caltrans projects, there will be closures of on ramps and off ramps of I-280. Listed below are details of these closures:

- **From 8 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 10 through 6 a.m., Thursday, Sept. 11:**
 - 1) Northbound I-280 on-ramp from Geneva Avenue
- **From 8 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 11 through 6 a.m., Friday, Sept. 12:**
 - 1) Northbound I-280 off-ramp to Geneva Avenue
 - 2) Southbound I-280 off-ramp to John Daly Boulevard
- **From 8 p.m., Friday, Sept. 12 through 6 a.m., Saturday, Sept. 13:**
 - 1) Northbound I-280 on-ramp from Alemany Boulevard

Signage will be placed in advance of these closures and detour routes.

NEW: Repaving 20th Avenue from Buckingham Way South through Winston Drive Intersection

Tuesday, Sept. 9 through Friday, Sept. 12: Stonestown will be repaving 20th Avenue from the south end of Buckingham Drive to just north of Winston Drive over four days. Construction hours are from 4 a.m. until 4 p.m. daily. During this work:

- The following Muni routes will be re-routed: **1)** 18 46th Avenue; **2)** 57 Parkmerced; and **3)** 58 Lake Merced
- The 29 Sunset will experience some delays through the area of Winston Drive and 20th Avenue

NEW: Sewer Replacement and Street Reconstruction in the Wharf Area

Now through Mid-October: As part of this work, bus stops will be relocated and some bus lines will be rerouted. The work area is Powell Street between Jefferson and North Point streets, and, on North Point Street between Mason and Powell streets. The following Muni routes will be impacted by the construction work:

- The 39 Coit: Some stops will be relocated
- The 28 19th Avenue has been rerouted in the area due to work impacts at the terminal

NEW: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements

Now until 2027: Replacement work of sewer and water lines is currently taking place along Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street.

Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated. This coming week, temporary bus stop relocations include inbound stops at 20th Avenue, Park Presidio and 9th Avenue.

ONGOING: Supporting Trips to School and Work: Muni Service Changes Started on Aug. 30, 2025

The SFMTA is changing Muni service on a few routes since the beginning of this month to make it even easier to get to school and work in the morning. These changes are based on direct feedback from riders and operators. These changes aim to improve your Muni experience. They address weekday crowding on routes used by students, express service for downtown commuters and connections to regional transit is expanding.

Weekday changes since Tuesday, Sept. 2. The SFMTA is reallocating resources without raising costs. That means the SFMTA is making Muni schedules more efficient while saving money. Here's what's changing and why:

Since Tuesday, Sept. 2, the 7:15 a.m. and 7:45 a.m. trips returned to the 1X California Express. The 30X Marina Express added a new morning run at 8:15 a.m. Riders taking the 49 Van Ness-Mission, there are more buses during the busiest part of the morning. Schedules have been adjusted to improve the 8 Bayshore and 29 Sunset in the evening peak. This is because students rely on the 8 Bayshore, 29 Sunset and 49 Van Ness/Mission for their trips to school.

There will also be a few Muni stop changes based on feedback and ongoing construction. These updates will not cost more. The SFMTA is just reallocating existing resources to where they are needed most.

ONGOING: Cable Car Sheaves Upgrade Project

Since Tuesday, Feb. 18, crews have been working to restore the cable car system sheaves, which are massive, grooved wheels that guide the underground cables through specialized pulley systems.

These upgrades will continue through Sept. 2025. During this work:

- there will be occasional closures of individual cable car segments;
- bus shuttles will replace cable car lines where work is being done;
- at least one cable car route will remain open to the public during normal operating hours while sections are being upgraded.
