Edward Mason provided an update on corporate commuter buses. This is the fourth year that the program has been in effect. The bus volume increased without an environmental impact report. Thanks to neighborhood diligence, violations are being noted and controlled. Those violations include blocking bike lanes, operating at discontinued stops and driving on weight restricted streets. There are now concurrent departures which back up 24th Street. Neighbors deal with engine noise and a gentrified transit system.

5. Presentation, discussion and possible action regarding a retail development concept for the Union Square/Market Street Station, Chinatown Station and the 5th and Mission Parking Garage. (Explanatory documents include a slide presentation.)
