- Baseball fans transferring from BART may purchase round trip Muni transfer tickets at the Embarcadero Station two and a half hours prior to the start time of the game.
- Transfers will be valid for up to two hours after the end of event.

Use of Clipper® Card

Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper® Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Golden Gate Ferry and Transit and San Francisco Bay Ferry provide the same discount on return trips.

Customers can buy tickets ahead of time and activate when they are ready to ride - with MuniMobile, your phone is your fare.

Muni customers who purchase fares in advance using a Clipper[®] Card or use the official SFMTA app, MuniMobile, can save 25 cents per trip. A single ride fare on Muni is good for 90 minutes of travel, whether it be on a single route or a trip with multiple transfers across buses and light rail.

As a reminder to fans, in order to reduce congestion on city streets after all events at AT&T Park, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets from the seventh inning until after the post-game traffic has died down. Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street (Peter R. Maloney) Bridge will be closed to all traffic except streetcars. buses, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period. Giants fans parked south of Mission Creek Channel who are heading north of the channel are encouraged to exit to the south along 3rd or 4th streets in order to avoid congestion on King and 3rd streets after AT&T Park events.

NEW: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' Chase Center and growth in the Mission Bay. the SFMTA is constructing a new center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. This new, larger platform will service both the inbound and outbound trains and greatly expand transit capacity in preparation for large crowds.

Sunday, May 6: Since last Sunday, May 6, initial construction for potholing of the Overhead Contact System (OCS) started on 3rd Street between Mission Bay North to Mariposa Street to determine if there are any existing utility conflicts. Construction will require intermittent closures of the curbside traffic lane and will last approximately two weeks.

UPDATE: Twin Peaks Tunnel Improvements Weekend Early Closures

Now until June 2018: On weekend evenings and mornings, there will be preparatory work taking place inside Twin Peak Tunnel ahead of the summer closure. In order to allow this vital work to take place, stations will close early on Friday and Saturday nights. Buses will run in place of the K, L and M lines during closures of the Twin Peaks Tunnel.

Friday, May 11 through Sunday, May 13: In addition to bus substitutions on the K, L and M lines and closures at West Portal and Forest Hill stations, this weekend evening work will include closures of Church and Castro Stations:

- 11 p.m., Friday, May 11 through 9 a.m., Saturday, May 12
- 11 p.m., Saturday, May 12 through 9 a.m., Saturday, May 12

During weekends, train service will operate with usual schedule, from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.

Hours of Tunnel Closure and Bus Substitution on K, L and M Lines:

- From 11 p.m., Friday through 9 a.m., Saturday
- From 11 p.m., Saturday through 9 a.m., Sunday

Below is additional information for specific line riders between 11 p.m. on Fridays and 5 a.m., Saturdays:

- K, L and M buses will service all stops
- Owl bus service will run as normal

Inbound Service between 5 and 9 a.m., Saturday and Sunday:

- L Customers: L buses will service all stops between San Francisco Zoo and Embarcadero
- K Customers: Board a K bus to West Portal Station and transfer to a L or KLM bus.
- M Customers: Board an M bus to West Portal Station and transfer to a L or KLM bus

Outbound Service between 5 and 9 a.m., Saturday and Sunday:

- L Customers: L buses will service all stops between Embarcadero and San Francisco Zoo
- K Customers: Board an L or KLM bus to West Portal Station and transfer to a K bus
- M Customers: Board an L or KLM bus to West Portal Station and transfer to an M bus

<u>UPDATE: Twin Peaks Tunnel Improvements Weekend Early Closures continued</u>

Customers can board all buses at Muni Shuttle route stops designated with a "Muni Metro Shuttle" yellow half-moon sign.

This preparatory work is being done ahead of the Twin Peaks Tunnel summer closure. In the summer, 100-year-old Twin Peaks Tunnel will be closed for up to 60 consecutive days in order to replace aging tracks and complete major tunnel improvements.

Upcoming 72-hour Closure During Memorial Day Weekend: May 25 through 28

Friday, May 25 through Monday, May 28: During Memorial Day weekend, the Twin Peaks Tunnel will be closed after regular train service late Friday night and will remain closed until regular service starts early morning on Tuesday, May 29. This closure will allow for important work to occur and allow for test out of transportation plan that will be used during the 60-day closure this summer.

During the tunnel closure:

- West Portal and Forest Hill stations will be closed for the weekend.
- M Ocean View Bus will operate from San Jose and Geneva avenues to Church Station.
- L Taraval Bus will operate from San Francisco Zoo to Castro Station.
- K Ingleside Train will operate between St. Francis Circle and Balboa Park Station.

UPDATE: Muni Rail Rehabilitation Project

Starting Monday, May 14 and continuing for about four weeks. N Judah track maintenance work will take place at the intersection of 11th Avenue and Judah Street. During construction, the N Judah rail service will operate without interruption. While Judah Street remains open, vehicular traffic along 11th Avenue at Judah Street will be detoured.

Work hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

Neighbors can expect noise during construction. To accommodate vital materials and equipment, about six parking spaces will be unavailable near the job site.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

The Van Ness Improvement Project is a civic improvement project that will bring San Francisco's first Bus Rapid Transit system. To maximize the benefits of construction, the City will also be replacing major utilities including water, sewer and emergency firefighting water systems. Work will also be done to repave Van Ness Avenue, enhance streetlights and landscaping, and install new sidewalk lighting and rain gardens.

Traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue have been shifted to create two construction zones for upcoming utility work. Because some of this work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. Neighbors will be notified of night noise 72-hours in advance of night work.

Friday, May 11: Between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

- Broadway: Crews are scheduled to work on sewer main installation. Intensive noise and vibration is expected.
- Washington Street: Crews are scheduled to pothole to confirm underground utilities for upcoming sewer work.
- Clay to Sutter streets: Crews are scheduled to prepare the area for upcoming sewer
- Post Street: Crews are scheduled to work on updating the emergency firefighting water system. Disruptive noise is expected.
- Eddy Street: Crews are scheduled to work water main installation.
- Hayes to Fell streets: Crews are scheduled to pothole to confirm underground utilities for upcoming sewer work.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project continued

Neighbors are advised to anticipate construction-related noise, as crews work diligently to complete necessary night work.

ONGOING: Central Subway Project

Pavement restoration work has resumed at some intersections along 4th Street between King and Bryan streets. Construction of the 4th and Brannan streets surface station platform is ongoing. Until further notice, traffic reroutes will remain in effect.

Sewer replacement work continues at night at 4th and Howard streets. Work hours are from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two through lanes are in place southbound 4th Street. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted.

One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street restoration work is continuing on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets.

Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley is under a long-term temporary closure to vehicular traffic as station construction continues. Pedestrian access to Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley remains open.

The Central Subway project is the first underground line to link the north and south corridors of the city, and will provide a direct connection to major retail, sporting and cultural venues while efficiently transporting people to jobs, educational opportunities and other amenities throughout San Francisco.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

Now until Further Notice: The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in early 2018.

The Mission Bay Loop is a key component for San Francisco's T Third rail line and is critical to operating the T Third Central Subway service plan. The loop provides turn-around capabilities for the T Third Street light rail line via a connection of trackway from 3rd Street to 18th, Illinois and 19th streets, which will allow the SFMTA to operate the necessary service levels needed to support current and planned growth within the eastern portion of San Francisco.

Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. Traveling around and through the construction area should expect minor delays.

Since early April 2017, the contractor has been working on the sewer infrastructure within the center of Illinois Street starting at 18th and Illinois streets. General work hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project (approximately until winter of 2018).

Traffic lanes traveling both north and south will remain open and there will be flaggers posted to help direct traffic. The northbound bike lane will be converted to a shared roadway. Expect minor delays when traveling around and through the construction area.

Local access to properties along the project site will be maintained. Sewer work is scheduled to be completed by summer of 2018.

ONGOING: 8th Street Safety Project Phase Two

The 8th Street Safety Project Phase Two will extend the parking-protected bikeway on 8th Street south by three blocks, from Harrison to Townsend streets. In addition, the project will construct pedestrian safety improvements, bus stop upgrades, signal upgrades, and reconfigure loading zones.

The project is in construction. Crews from both San Francisco Public Works and SFMTA are working diligently to complete these vital safety improvements.

Traffic/Transit Impact

- Traffic will be routed around construction activity as necessary, but will not be detoured. Pedestrian pathways and access to driveways and commercial/residential buildings will be maintained at all times.
- The 19 Polk bus stops at Harrison, Brannan, and Townsend streets may be temporarily relocated or closed while bus boarding islands are being constructed. Customers should follow posted signage to locate the closest 19 Polk bus stop during construction.

Work is currently scheduled to be completed in May, weather permitting.

ONGOING: 8th and Market Boarding Island

Now until Further Notice: A new transit boarding island is currently under construction on 8th Street between Market and Stevenson streets. In coordination with a sewer upgrade effort, construction is in progress and may last until May 2018.

The transit boarding island will provide more space and reliability for transit passengers, and a protected space for bicyclists riding between the sidewalk and boarding island.

ONGOING: 8th and Market Boarding Island continued

Traffic/Transit Impact

- Please follow posted signage to locate the closest 19 Polk and 83X Mid-Market Express bus stop during construction.
- At times, there may be temporary lane closures as crews perform work resulting in possible travel delays. Please plan to allow for extra travel time during construction due to possible delays.
- Traffic will be routed around construction activity as necessary, but will not be detoured. Pedestrian pathways and access to driveways and commercial/ residential buildings will be maintained at all times.

ONGOING: Polk Streetscape Project

The Polk Streetscape Project is an effort to create a safer, more vibrant corridor for all residents of San Francisco. In addition to increasing safety for everyone traveling on Polk Street, this project will incorporate new lighting, landscaping and street infrastructure. The project is anticipated to be completed in six segments, with construction taking approximately 24 months to complete. General work hours will be from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Construction began since October 2016 with sewer work on North Point Street, from Polk to Larkin streets.

San Francisco Public Works will be working to incorporate key safety, sewer and water utility infrastructure improvements and streetscape enhancements along Polk Street, from Beach to McAllister streets. Improvements also include: paving, ADA curb ramps installation, alleyway improvements, sidewalk bulb-outs and bus bulb-outs, traffic signal upgrades, street light upgrades and bicycle lane improvements.

Annual Bay to Breakers Race

Sunday, May 20: The annual Bay to Breakers Race will take place. The SFMTA will provide pre- and post-race service on several Muni rail lines and bus routes for the event.

One of the largest running events in the world, Bay to Breakers will close many streets from the starting line at Main and Howard streets on the east side of San Francisco to the finishing line on the west side of the city on the Great Highway near Fulton Street. Once the race begins, travelers will only have two options to cross the north/south portion of the race course: The Embarcadero and Crossover Drive (which connects 19th Avenue, south of Golden Gate Park to Park Presidio Boulevard and 25th Avenue, north of Golden Gate Park).
