NEW: BART Early Bird Bus Shuttle

Starting Monday, February 11, BART will begin weekday service at 5 a.m. In partnership with Muni and other Bay Area transit agencies, BART is providing bus service to select BART stations from 4 to 5 a.m. In San Francisco, BART Early Bird Route 714 will stop at Balboa Park, Glen Park, 24th Mission, 16th Mission BART stations and at the Temporary Transbay Terminal.

Customers connecting to East Bay BART destinations must transfer at the Temporary Transbay Terminal on BART Early Bird Route 704 to El Cerrito del Norte or Route 705 to 20th & Broadway in Oakland. Shuttles coming into San Francisco from the East Bay will end at the Temporary Transbay Terminal where customers may transfer to Muni or the 714 BART Early Bird Shuttle to the Daly City BART. IBM Think 2019

Tuesday, February 12 through Saturday, February 16: The IBM Think 2019 conference will be held at Moscone Center from Tuesday, February 12 through Saturday, February 16. Attendance of more than 40,000 is anticipated. Conference activities will take place at Moscone North, South and West, as well as at YBCA and in the Metreon and Yerba Buena Gardens. Heavy pedestrian traffic should be expected around Moscone Center and on 3rd and 4th streets between Howard and Market streets. For more information visit https://www.ibm.com/events/think/.

The following street closure will be required:

- Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets will be closed from **7 p.m.**, **Thursday**, **February 7 to 7 a.m.**, **Monday**, **February 18**.
- In addition there will be lane closures and parking restrictions at various times on Howard Street between 2nd and 3rd streets, and 4th and 5th streets; on 3rd Street between Folsom and Mission streets; on 4th Street between Minna and Howard streets; and on Folsom Street between 3rd and 4th streets.

Thursday, February 14: **Think by the Bay** will take place at Pier 39 from **6:30 to 9:30 p.m.** Shuttle buses will transport attendees there from Moscone Center. There will be lane closures on Howard Street between 4th and 5th streets and Folsom Street between 3rd and 4th streets from 3 to 8 p.m. to facilitate shuttle departures.

Significant traffic congestion is anticipated in and around Moscone Center for the duration of the closure. Travelers are encouraged to take public transportation or use alternate routes. Howard Street traffic will be detoured via southbound 2nd Street to Harrison Street, or via New Montgomery Street to Hawthorne Street to either Folsom or Harrison streets.

There will be a signed bicycle detour for people on bikes on Howard Street to turn north at 2nd Street to Market Street. People on bikes who wish to stay on Howard Street have the option to dismount at Howard and 3rd streets and walk their bicycle through the event along the north sidewalk. Signage will be placed in advance of the street closures and detour routes. Caltrans will activate electronic message signs on major freeways entering the city to notify motorists of the closures. SFMTA Parking Control Officers and San Francisco Police Officers will be deployed at key intersections throughout the closures.



Giants FanFest

Saturday, February 9: The 26th annual KNBR 680 Giants FanFest will take place between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. at Oracle Park (formerly AT&T Park). An attendance of more than 30,000 participants is expected throughout the day. For event details, visit www.sanfrancisco.giants.mlb.com.

Due to the undergoing Mission Bay Arena Platform Project, Muni's E Embarcadero service is temporarily cancelled and the T Third line will operate on buses.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: Geary Rapid Project

The first phase of construction as part of the <u>Geary Rapid Project</u> has begun. Work to replace aging water and sewer lines between Masonic and Van Ness avenues is being done in coordination with San Francisco Public Utilities Commission. As part of this work, there will be temporary lane closures and/or parking restrictions. *Construction scheduling is subject to change due to weather delays or unexpected field conditions.*

Weekend lane closures:

- The eastbound Geary frontage road from Presidio Avenue to Lyon Street will be closed Saturdays and Sundays from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., through mid-February, while crews work on sewer main replacement.
- Eastbound traffic will be slightly detoured, and parking will be restricted on the south side of Geary Boulevard between Presidio Avenue and Lyon Street.
- No bus stops will be affected. Inbound 38/38R Geary buses will be slightly rerouted, which will add some travel time.

UPDATE: Central Subway Project

Utility trenching and upgrade work may resume at 4th and Brannan intersection. This work is scheduled to occur during weekends, from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. At 4th and Howard streets, utility upgrade work is ongoing, Monday through Friday, overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted. One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street and sidewalk restoration work continues on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets, as well as on O'Farrell at Stockton. In Chinatown, the Chinese New Year work moratorium is in effect from Monday, January 21 through Monday, February 11 for work on Stockton Street. The sidewalk on the west side of Stockton, south of Washington, adjacent to the worksite has been temporarily reopened through the moratorium. UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

On Friday, February 8, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to work on street light conduits and sewer main installation at the following locations:

- Van Ness at Lombard Street
- Van Ness at Greenwich Street
- Van Ness at Union Street
- Van Ness at Broadway
- Van Ness at Sutter Street. Intensive noise and vibration expected.
- Van Ness between Fell and Market streets. Intensive noise and vibration expected
- Van Ness between Mission and Market streets. Disruptive noise expected.

Because some work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, work is limited to nighttime hours. For more project details and the latest construction updates, visit sfmta.com/vanness.



ONGOING: Muni Metro Elevator Safety Modernization Project

Since Monday, January 21 and continuing for about ten weeks, the inbound platform elevator at Church Station has been out of service for about ten weeks while the SFMTA has been working on upgrading the unit.

While the elevator is out of service, customers can use the following options to access Church Station:

- Take an inbound train for L Taraval, M Ocean View, K Ingleside/T Third Streets lines or S Shuttle Customers can exit at Van Ness Station, proceed to the outbound platform and take any L, M, K/T or S lines to Church Station.
- **Heading inbound from Church Station** Customers can use the outbound elevator to access any outbound train, get off at Castro Station, proceed to inbound platform and take any inbound train to continue travel.
- Accessible service to the Church and Market area is available on the following Muni routes or lines:
 - J Church (Accessible stops at Duboce and Church as well as inbound at Church at Market)
 - o N Judah (Accessible stop at Duboce and Church)
 - o F Market & Wharves (serves Church, Van Ness and Castro stations)
 - o 37 Corbett (serves Church and Castro stations)
- Customers with disabilities can use station escalators to access the inbound platform.

Upon completion of this upgrade work at Church Station, the SFMTA will begin working on elevators at Castro and Forest Hill stations. The entire upgrade project is expected to take about four years to complete.

ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' Chase Center, the SFMTA is constructing a new 320-foot center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. The existing platform will be demolished. The new track alignment will include one single and one double crossover to facilitate the movement of vehicles as operations requires. Other associated work includes modification of the overhead contact system, and both above and below ground utility relocation work. Construction will require four phases that will necessitate three separate transit service plans. For more information visit www.SFMTA.com/MissionBavPlatform.



ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project continued

Buses are providing T Third service from Tuesday, January 22 through March 2019 in order to accommodate the next phases of construction. Once the T Third returns to train service, the Muni platform at UCSF Mission Bay will remain out of service through late April 2019. The T Third will continue to operate but will skip that stop. Customers should board at Mission Rock and Mariposa stations.

T Third bus stops that were rerouted to 4th Street due to construction will return to 3rd Street starting Saturday, February 9. Northbound and southbound T third bus stops at Mission Rock, UCSF Mission Bay, and Mariposa will return to 3rd Street starting Saturday, February 9.

E Embarcadero and 83X Mid-Market Express are temporarily canceled since Tuesday, January 22 and continuing through March. Alternative routes include 47 Van Ness for the 83X and the N Judah and F Market & Wharves for the E.

55 16th Street is being rerouted onto 4th Street since Tuesday, January 22 but will return to its original route on Saturday, February 9.

Beginning Saturday, February 9 one lane northbound and one lane southbound will be open along 3rd Street between 16^{th} and 50th streets.

ONGOING: Third Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in spring 2019. Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic. In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.



ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop continued

A partial street closure is currently in effect in order to accommodate duct bank work on Illinois Street between 18th and 19th streets through spring of 2019. Outer traffic lanes traveling both north and south on Illinois Street will remain open for through traffic. Immediately following the duct bank work, the track work will begin.

President's Day Holiday Muni Service, Parking Will Be Enforced

Monday, February 18, 2019 (President's Day Holiday), Muni will operate on a Saturday schedule.

Parking meters and seven-day street sweeping will be enforced citywide on the holiday. Residential parking permits and Monday-Friday daytime street sweeping and commuter towaway will not be enforced.

Vehicles creating a hazard and/or an unsafe condition (i.e. double parking, blocking a bike lane, blocking driveways, blocking crosswalks, fire hydrants, etc.) are subject to receiving citations and can possibly be towed.

Note: Parking meters in the City are enforced Monday through Saturday with the exception of the following areas where parking meters are enforced seven days per week throughout the year except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day:

- Parking meters in the Fisherman's Wharf area
- On and near The Embarcadero roadway
- In the Special Event Area around AT&T Park
- Five metered off-street parking facilities listed below:
 - o 8th Avenue at Clement Street
 - o 9th Avenue at Clement Street
 - o Geary Boulevard at 21st Avenue
 - o 18th Avenue at Geary Boulevard
 - Pierce Street Garage (between Lombard and Chestnut streets)
