## LAKE MERCED QUICK-BUILD PROJECT

The area north and east of Lake Merced Park on Lake Merced Boulevard between Font and Sunset boulevards is part of San Francisco's Vision Zero High Injury Network (HIN), where 75% of the City's traffic injuries and fatalities occur on just 13% of San Francisco streets. The Lake Merced Quick-Build Project aims to improve traffic safety and comfort along Lake Merced Boulevard between Skyline Boulevard and John Muir Drive.



From 2016-2021 there were 89 collisions along the project corridor, which resulted in 87 injuries and two fatalities.



Almost 75% (66 out of 89) of all collisions happened at an intersection.



30% of reported incidents (27 collisions) cite unsafe speeds as a primary factor of the collision



## Vision Zero and the Quick-Build Program

This project is part of the SFMTA's Vision Zero Quick-Build Program, which stems from two executive directives from Mayor London Breed for faster delivery of safety improvements and to deliver higher quality bike facilities, to prevent collisions and increase traffic safety. Quick-builds are reversible, adjustable traffic safety improvements that can be installed relatively rapidly.
