J Church Muni Forward Project Overview

Project segments

- Church/Market streets intersection
- San Jose Ave (I-280 to Ocean Ave)
- Noe Valley (future segment)

Project goals

- Improve reliability on the J Church
- Improve safety, access and comfort at J Church stops on San Jose Ave and Church St
- Address traffic safety concerns along San Jose Ave
- Support small business and neighborhood vitality at Church/Market intersection





Church/Market Transit Plaza

Church/Market transit stop overview

- Thousands of boardings on J Church, F Market, 22 Fillmore, 37 Corbett
- Transfer point to Church Street Muni Metro Station
- Key neighborhood commercial hub
- Identified as key "transit center" in San Francisco General Plan

Quick-build upgrades

- Quick-build improvements made from 2020-2023 enhance safety/accessibility
- More quick-build upgrades in development





Church/Market Transit Plaza

Permanent plaza improvements

- SFMTA Board approved permanent transit plaza in December 2021 to improve the boarding experience and support neighborhood vibrancy
 - Seeking approval today for sidewalk-level bikeway through plaza that could be part of the final design
- Detail design on permanent plaza underway with Public Works & local merchants
- Construction to begin in 2025

Features of permanent transit plaza (currently in detailed design phase)



San Jose Ave (I-280 to Ocean Ave): Challenges

- **Safety**: High-injury corridor with traffic and walking safety concerns
- Transit Reliability: Service can be unpredictable
- Accessibility: 1.7-mile gap between wheelchair-accessible stops









San Jose Avenue: Outreach

Outreach Overview

- Pre-project: community advocacy around improving safety for people walking in the neighborhood
- Late 2022 through Summer 2023: Initial round of outreach to key community members and community-based organizations
- Early 2023: Presentations to neighborhood improvement association, community-based organizations, neighborhood leaders and merchants along the corridor
- August 2023: Final proposal presented to community

San Jose Avenue: Proposed Improvements

- **Transit lanes** to reduce speeding and improve transit reliability
- Extended boarding islands to provide safe loading for all train doors
- Wheelchair-accessible
 transit stops to enhance
 accessibility
- Flashing beacons, sidewalk corner bulbouts, daylighting and continental crosswalk striping to improve safety for people walking

Continental crosswalk striping



Crossing San Jose Avenue at Balboa Park



1) Havelock: Continental crosswalk; no stop sign for San Jose Ave traffic. Rapid flashing beacon added in early 2023. Daylighting proposed.

2) Santa Ynez: Crosswalk; all-way stop sign. Crosswalk to be upgraded with continental striping.

3) Sgt. John V. Young (minor park street): No marked crosswalk.

4) Ocean: Continental crosswalk; signalized.

Today's Legislation

Church/Market

• Class IV Bikeway through transit plaza

San Jose Ave Corridor

- Bus, taxi, and left turn only lanes from Ocean Ave to Cotter St
- Left lane must turn left (northbound) at Ocean Ave
- Extended boarding islands and new accessible stops at Santa Ynez Ave and Santa Rosa Ave
- Intersection daylighting at San Juan Ave and Paulding Ave
- Rapid flashing beacons at San Juan Ave and Paulding Ave
- Pedestrian bulbs at Paulding St and Baden St



Next Steps

October 17, 2023 (now)

- SFMTA Board of Directors review of proposals for Church/Market and San Jose Ave
- Update to Board on Muni service (separate calendar item)

Late 2023/Early 2024

- Quick-build implementation on San Jose Ave
- Planning and outreach for Noe Valley segment

2023-2025

 Detailed design of transit plaza improvements and San Jose Ave segment

2025-2027

 Construction of full capital elements at Church/Market and on San Jose Ave, including boarding islands, accessible stops, bulbs
