



Update from SFPUC


- Work in Segment A is nearly complete.
- The next several weeks include Cured-in-Place Lining (CIPL) work, which is a trenchless method to rehabilitate old sewer pipes without digging them up.
 - The pipe lining process typically takes two to three days and will be 24-hour continuous work. Water and sewer service will not be interrupted during this work.
- Main line water and sewer work continue in Segment B.

Surface contract status update

- Detailed design has been completed
- In preparation for construction phase, \$29.5 million in planned state cap and trade funds (TIRCP) were allocated to SFMTA by California Transportation Commission on 3/20/26. The remaining funding for construction comes from local funds that are programmed.




Engage with and support the small business community

- Targeted, pre-construction outreach to businesses (e.g. ambassadors going door to door to businesses adjacent to inform about what to expect during bus bulb construction, inform of trees being planted adjacent to businesses)
- Create banners, as needed, for businesses during construction
- OEWD support with a business liaison, small business services



Inform neighbors about upcoming and ongoing construction

- Signage in active construction zones
- Bi-weekly construction forecasts posted on website and sent over email/text
- Mailer/postcards announcing the beginning of construction
- Social media and newspaper ad campaigns
- Multi-lingual updates to Chinese- and Russian-speaking community (including WeChat updates to Chinese-speaking community)

As part of the Geary Rapid Project, utility and sidewalk work is being done by contractor Mitchell Engineering. The Geary Rapid Project aims to make traveling on Geary a more reliable and safer experience and is coordinated with other City-sponsored work to keep infrastructure in a state of good repair. This contract includes:

- Replacement of aging water mains on Geary Street between Van Ness and Market.
- Traffic signal upgrades.
- Sidewalk extensions at some intersections to improve safety.
- Sidewalk extensions at some bus stops to improve transit.
