PUBLIC COMMENT:

David Pilpel requested documents regarding the SFMTA being eligible for funding as related to the infrastructure bill and expressed concern over transit operator discipline and required video evidence.

Joe Kunzler expressed continued support for the vaccination mandate and thanked Director Tumlin for his support of free transfers by 2024 and a go anywhere pilot project for 2023.

Francisco Da Costa commented on critical race theory, looked forward to infrastructure bill funds, and requested that the Board help taxi drivers.

Anastasia Yovanopoulos commented on transit operator staffing shortage.

Dave Alexander expressed concern over the DeYoung Museum Access for All interest group and spreading disinformation.

Barry Taranto thanked Director Tumlin for sharing about work at the 4th and King Street intersection, expressed condolences to the educator that passed away at Union and Franklin Streets, and shared that some Shared Spaces are blocking sightlines for drivers.

<u>California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter</u> <u>31</u>: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions</u>: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
