Quick-Build implementation update

- Quick-Build substantially completed between September and November 2023, with small punchlist items continuing to be implemented
- Several small color curb changes, such as adjusted loading zones, were made in response to stakeholder feedback
- A new lagging left-turn arrow at 11th Avenue is planned to be implemented in the coming months (westbound Geary to southbound 11th Ave)



General Loading Zone Hours at Ms. Marian's Dance Garden were modified to begin at 3pm

Quick-Build implementation update

- 71 new bicycle parking racks were installed on sidewalks throughout the corridor near businesses and other trip generators
- Bus shelters permitting process is in progress, with Public Works-convened hearings anticipated soon and shelter installation shortly thereafter
- Quick-Build evaluation work underway with data collection occurring through April 2024 and analysis/report preparation to follow
- Very few public inquiries to project team in last few months



New sidewalk bicycle parking rack on 3rd Avenue at the Burger King

Quick-Build implementation update

- Team is pursuing installation of a temporary bus bulb at the 25th Ave inbound stop
- Would provide room for shelter and more room for passengers to wait sooner



In coordination with the affordable housing development underway, the outbound 6th Ave bus stop is planned to be relocated to a new permanent farside bus bulb later this year (tentatively Fall)

Quick-Build implementation update

- 14th Avenue bike-share re-location in progress
- Tree removal notice posted for 30-day period March 14 to April 13
 - 2 small trees to be removed to enable 3-foot wide sidewalk expansion
 - 4 new trees to be planted
- Implementation later this year, including 3 new parking spaces on 14th Ave

Geary Community Enhancement Survey
The Geary Boulevard Improvement Project (SFMTA com/Geary) includes a community enhancement element to beautify the com/dor. Depending on the enhancement selected, there may be an opportunity to highlight the Richmond Districts rich history and/or culture, or to contribute to neighborhood identity or place-making. The selected treatment will be installed on Geary Boulevard along with other planned utility, transit and safety improvements. Your input will help determine what idea is selected in the coming months! We will have a second round of outreach later this year to share the favorite treatment(s) and ask for feedback on the details of the design. The Geary Boulevard Improvement Project team has identified a number of potential community enhancement elements. These options were selected based on cost considerations and low maintenance needs. The options also focus on locations where there is opportunity to synergize with construction work already planned. For example, because the sidewalk is planned to be expanded at 38R Geary Rapid bus stop locations, many of the opportunities for enhancements to the sidewalk are focused at these bus stops.
A. Sidewalk pavers:
 Would add pavers at select bus stops. Could include a decorative brick edge like those seen at some Muni bus stops or colored decorative pavers.

Community enhancement outreach: Next steps

- Later this year: Select enhancement option(s) and conduct a second round of outreach to seek feedback on design details
- **By end of year:** Finalize enhancement details and incorporate into project design package
- **2026-2027:** Implementation during overall project construction

7. Geary Rapid Project update

Stanyan to Market Street

- The restoration of red thermoplastic transit lane colorization is complete. Only remaining work is transit lane stencils on O'Farrell Street. Waiting for shop capacity due to other high priority work.
- The contractor is continuing to maintain the new trees as part of the threeyear plant establishment period.
- SFPW admin team is working on final contract payments and closeout.
