The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the Planning Department, determined on April 11, 2024, that the following items (Transportation Code Amendments – On-Street Electric Vehicle Charging) are not defined as a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15060(c) and 15378(b):

6. <u>Various Locations Citywide – On-Street Car Share Parking</u> ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE

- A. Fillmore Street, median parking strip, from 48 feet to 60 feet north of Chestnut Street
- B. Gough Street, west side, from 95 feet to 113 feet north of Green Street
- C. Taylor Street, east side, from 20 feet to 38 feet south of Sacramento Street
- **D.** Santiago Street, north side, from 20 feet to 38 feet east of 24th Avenue
- E. Page Street, south side, from 142 feet to 160 feet east of Buchanan Street
- F. Buena Vista Avenue West, east side, from 20 feet to 29 feet south of Haight Street

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filling a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
