

Irving from 4th to 7th

Proposed Changes



Remove Stops at 7th Ave and 4th Ave

- Fewer stops along the route means Muni can travel the same distance in less time
- The transit stops at 4th and at 7th would be consolidated into a new stop between 5th and 6th.
- The average distance between stops would increase from 700 feet to 1000 feet.



New Stops between 5th and 6th Ave

Adding stops in this location would space stops more evenly along the route.

· Even spacing provides a balance between time spent walking to or from a stop and time spent riding the train for the average person.



New Pedestrian Bulbs at 4th Ave and 7th Ave

 Improves pedestrian safety by reducing the crossing distance at intersections. A shorter crossing distance for pedestrians also means less time stopped at red lights.



New Traffic Signal at Irving St and 4th Ave

· Reduces the amount of stops the train makes along its route and makes it possible to introduce tr ansit signal priority (TSP) at intersections.

• TSP keeps the light green for Muni as it approaches an intersection, saving time.

Install Transit Bulbs

between 5th Ave and 6th Ave

- Bulbs provide customers a safe place to wait for their train. Customers would no longer have to wait on the sidewalk and board the train in the street
- · Provides for seamless boarding of trains from the sidewalk for only the first car of a two-car train.
- This makes boarding faster and saves time at each stop, making every passenger's journey shorter.
- · Avoids extending the bulbs through driveways, and would remove three parking spaces on the south side of Irving and four spaces on the north side for a total of 7 spaces.
- · Allows space for a potential future project to add high-level accessible platforms for wheelchair boarding.



New Passenger Loading Zone on Irving St at 6th Ave

• A new passenger loading zone (white zone) would be established at the

corner of 6th Ave and Irving St, replacing an existing parking space.
