1. <u>Green Street between Leavenworth Street and Hyde Street – Shifting a Passenger</u> <u>Loading Zone for Daylighting</u>

1a) RESCIND – WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 5-MINUTE LIMIT, 7AM TO 10PM, DAILY

1101 Green Street, south side, from Leavenworth Street to 25 feet westerly (25-foot zone) **1b)ESTABLISH - RED ZONE, NO STOPPING ANYTIME**

1101 Green Street, south side, from Leavenworth Street to 20 feet westerly (20-foot zone) 1c)ESTABLISH – WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 5-MINUTE LIMIT, 7AM TO 10PM, DAILY

1101 Green Street, south side from 20 feet to 37 feet (17-foot zone) and from 50 feet to 58 feet west of Leavenworth Street (8-foot zone) (25 feet total), Russian Hill, Supervisor District 3, Color Curb Program, <u>ccp@sfmta.com</u>.

Per State law AB413, 20 feet at the near side of the intersection must be free of vehicles for visibility and this zone must be shifted to accommodate this daylighting.

This item was heard at the April hearing. A new location is being proposed, two meters over and the days have been extended.

Per the request of a restaurant and bar, this would provide space for customers to be dropped off and picked up.

117 Post Street, south side, from 67 feet to 109 feet west of Kearny Street in meter stall numbers 107 and 109 (42-foot zone), Financial District, Supervisor District 3, Color Curb Program, <u>ccp@sfmta.com</u>.

The sponsor of a Passenger Loading Zone requested the zone be moved closer to their frontage and that it be a General Loading Zone for customer access.

The sponsoring venue has requested that the existing loading regulations be adjusted to better match their loading needs.

6. <u>Mission Street between 6th Street and 7th Street – Establishing a Passenger Loading</u> Zone

The proposed loading zone would provide space for pickup and drop-offs at a residential building.
