2. <u>17th Street at Folsom Street – Rescind Motorcycle Parking</u> RESCIND – MOTORCYCLE PARKING

17th Street, north side, from 46 feet to 70 feet east of Folsom Street (Supervisor District 9) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Proposal to rescind motorcycle parking on the north side of 17th Street, formerly serving a motorcycle repair and sales shop at 3084 17th Street, now closed for over ten years.

<u>Claremont Boulevard at Portola Drive – 48 Quintara/24th Street Outbound Reroute by West Portal</u>

3(a). ESTABLISH - TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME

Claremont Boulevard, east side, from Portola Drive to 43 feet northerly

3(b). RESCIND - MUNI FLAG STOP

Proposal for changes to reroute the 48 Quintara/24th Street outbound to use Claremont Boulevard to improve transit operations.

4. <u>Stockton Street, between Washington Street and Broadway – Metered Commercial Loading</u> ESTABLISH – YELLOW METERED LOADING ZONES, 7AM-12PM, MONDAY THOUGH SATURDAY

- **A.** Stockton Street, east side, from 10 feet to 157 feet north of Washington Street (six yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1002 through #664-1012, even)
- **B.** Stockton Street, west side, from 20 feet to 92 feet north of Washington Street (three yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1003 through #664-1007, odd)
- C. Stockton Street, west side, from 9 feet to 82 feet south of Jackson Street (three yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1017 through #664-1021, odd)
- **D.** Stockton Street, west side, from 92 feet to 190 feet north of Washington Street (four yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1009 through #664-1015, odd)
- **E.** Stockton Street, west side, from 112.5 feet to 244.5 feet north of Jackson Street (six yellow commercial metered spaces, multispace meter #664-11001, odd stalls 3 through 13)
- **F.** Stockton Street, west side, from 5 feet to 79 feet north of Pacific Street (three yellow



commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1201 through #664-1205, odd)

- **G.** Stockton Street, west side, from 190 feet to 236 feet north of Pacific Street (two yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1225 and #664-1227)
- **H.** Stockton Street, east side, from 28 feet to 79 feet north of Jackson Street (two yellow commercial metered spaces, meters #664-1008 and #664-1110)
- I. Stockton Street, east side, from Stark Street to 88 feet southerly (four yellow commercial metered spaces, multispace meter #664-12002, even stalls 16-22) (Supervisor District 3) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Changing metered commercial loading zone operating schedules on Stockton Street between Washington Street and Broadway to provide more hours of general metered parking.

Proposal to establish red zone due to proposed 12-foot bulb-out for 1400 17th Street.

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San



Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
