Viktoriya Wise, Director of Streets, introduced Brent Jones, Director of Transit, to present special recognition to Transit staff. Director Wise then called up Jessica Garcia, Service Planning Manager, to share about August Service Changes.

Director Cajina joined the meeting.

Director Wise shared a speed safety camera update and recent events including the ADA 35th Anniversary Celebration, Chinatown Station Art Installation, and service for summer concerts.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Aleta Dupree expressed concern about service during concerts and needing to ensure service serves the whole city.

Griffin Lee was encouraged by service improvements, expressing support for more efficiencies, and questioned AB 645 revenue going towards traffic calming measures.

Speaker expressed support for the ADA program and celebration and questioned why the agency's budget was not included in the report.

Herbert Weiner commented the bicyclists should have licenses and expressed concern about for disabled riders needing to walk long distances to bus stops.

8. New or Unfinished Business by Board Members

Chair Tarlov announced the re-establishment of two select committees: Vision Zero Committee and Train Control Upgrade Project (TCUP) Committee. She also announced appointments to those committees: Director Cajina and Director Chen to the Vision Zero Committee and Director Felder to the Train Control Upgrade Project Committee.

Director Henderson thanked staff Joel Ramos and Viktoriya Wise for participating in a recent Bayview Town Hall.

PUBLIC COMMENT:



Aleta Dupree thanked the Board for bringing the TCUP committee back, expressing support for train control and its impact on more reliable service.

9. Public Comment

Members of the public may address the SFMTA Board of Directors on matters that are within the Board's jurisdiction and are not on today's calendar.

Thierry spoke about transportation, the need for self-control and awareness.

Griffin Lee questioned the hours of commercial loading zones and suggested shortening them while also urging better coordination of departments and enforcement.

Aleta Dupree highlighted the importance of Muni Mobile and the upcoming Clipper 2.0 improvements.

Rachel Reynolds requested a Next Bus screen on Market and 7th Streets and advocated for the return of a bus stop near Broderick and McAllister Streets to accommodate senior centers.

Lucy spoke as an RV resident and shared concerns about two-hour parking restrictions, asking for compassion and support for RV dwellers.

Speaker looked forward to hearing about community engagement during the budget process.

Zach expressed opposition to the RV parking restrictions and raised concerns about its impact on marginalized communities.

Speaker expressed concern about targeting RV families and low-income residents and urged for better solutions to the housing and rent crisis.

Charlie Fisch encouraged the Board to bring the RV item back for further amendments with more leniency.

Azucena Hernandez urged the Board to bring the RV item back and to create legislation to protect RV residents.

Herbert Weiner raised accessibility concerns about bus stops, including those on 19th Avenue.

Gregory Ruff expressed concern about agency management and communications and shared about an experience while trying to recover a towed car.

Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
