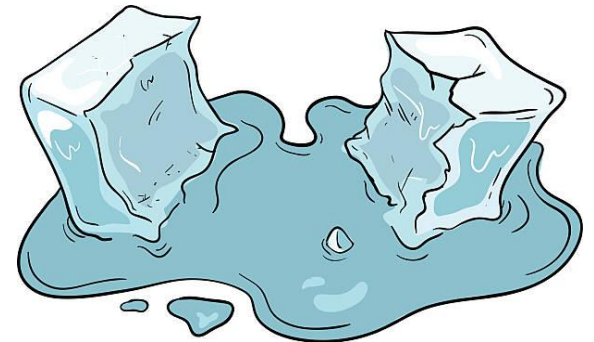

Quick-Build Implementation update

- Bus bulb at Geary/6th Avenue outbound has been completed and bus stop re-located to far side/west side of 6th Ave
- Completed in coordination with new affordable housing (383 6th Avenue) which is substantially complete. First residents moved in earlier this year

We recently completed [an evaluation](#) of our "Quick-Build" improvements on Geary. These upgrades are part of the [Geary Boulevard Improvement Project](#), which extends from Stanyan Street to 34th Avenue.

Quick-Build improvements can be done quickly with only paint and signs, but they pack a big punch.

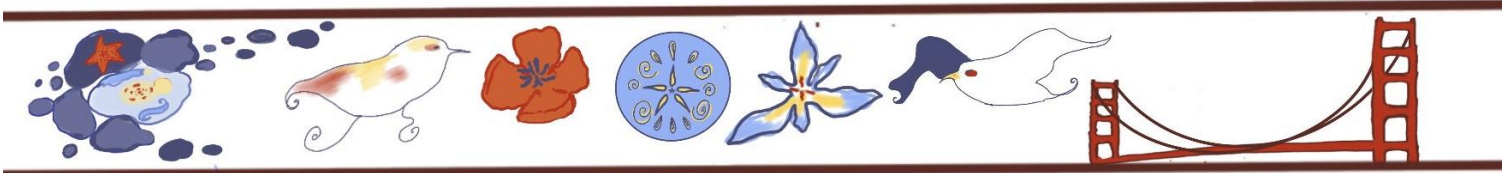

Example student design

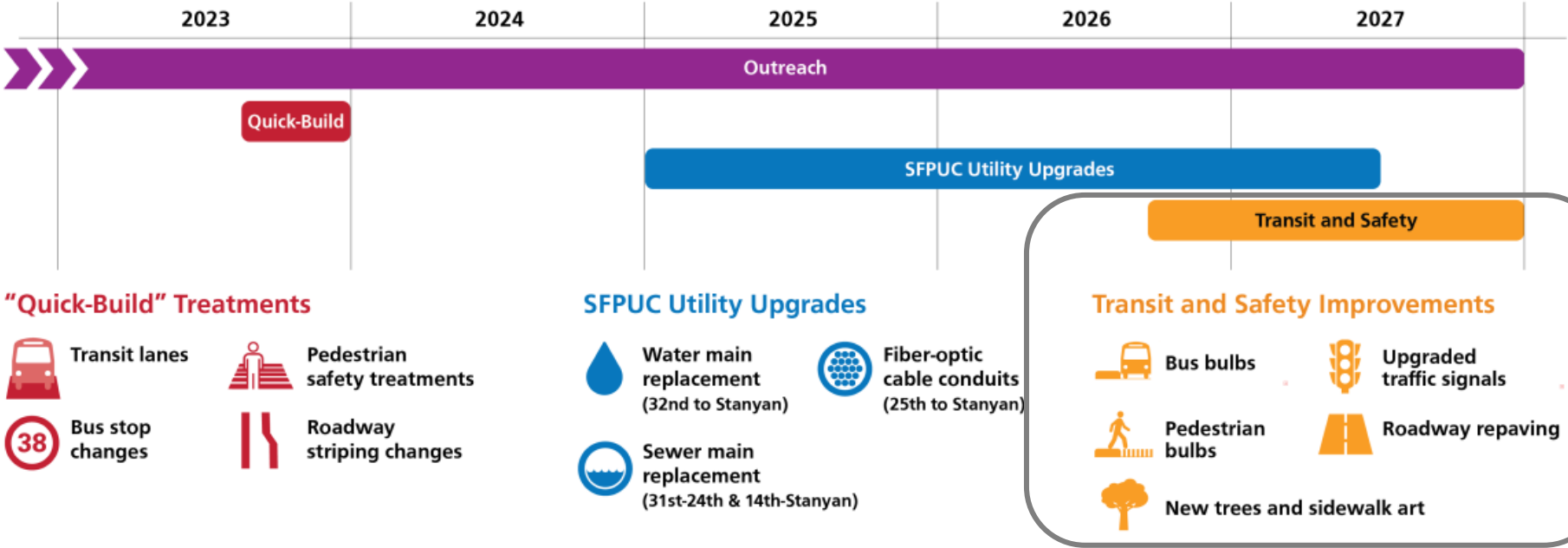


Example lithocrete mock-up

“Quick-Build” Treatments

- Transit lanes
- Pedestrian safety treatments
- Bus stop changes
- Roadway striping changes

SFPUC Utility Upgrades

- Water main replacement (32nd to Stanyan)
- Sewer main replacement (31st-24th & 14th-Stanyan)
- Fiber-optic cable conduits (25th to Stanyan)

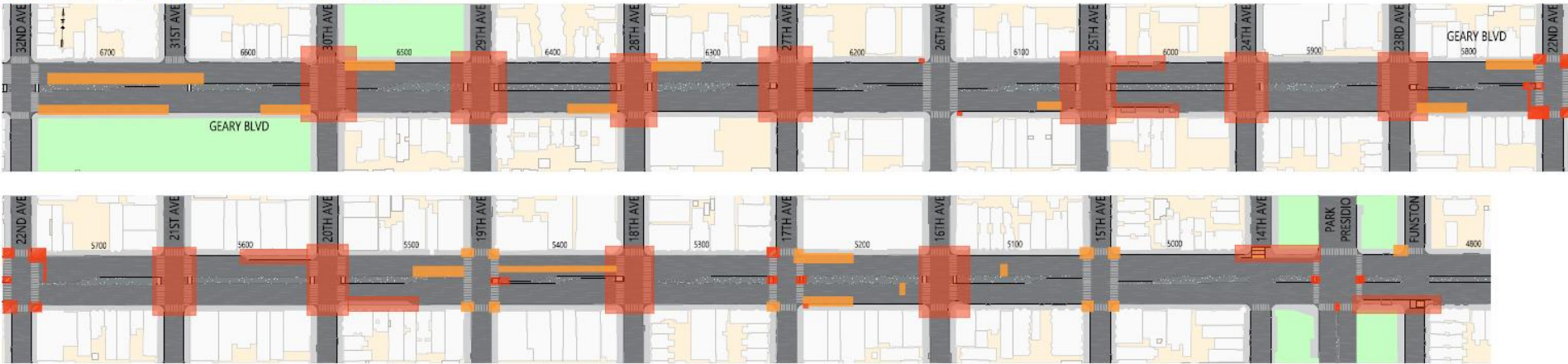
Transit and Safety Improvements

- Bus bulbs
- Pedestrian bulbs
- Upgraded traffic signals
- Roadway repaving
- New trees and sidewalk art

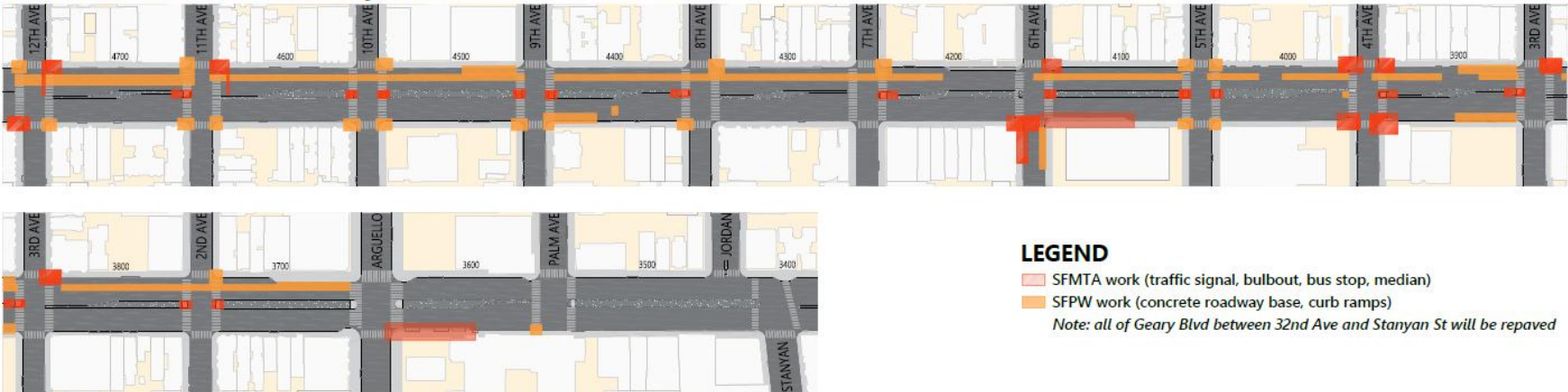

Geary surface contract look-ahead

SEGMENT A: 32nd Avenue to 12th Avenue



SEGMENT B: 12th Avenue to Stanyan Street



LEGEND

Red rectangle: SFMTA work (traffic signal, bulbout, bus stop, median)

Orange rectangle: SFPW work (concrete roadway base, curb ramps)

Note: all of Geary Blvd between 32nd Ave and Stanyan St will be repaved

Geary surface contract look-ahead

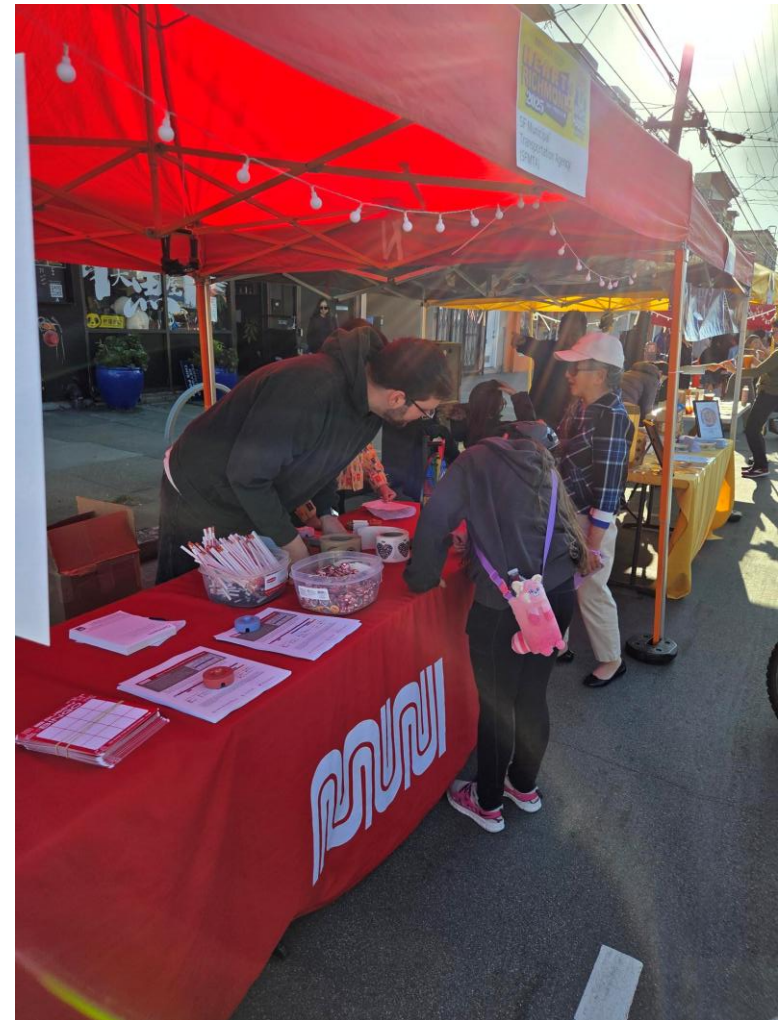
Typical construction durations:

Type of work	Typical duration
Traffic signal upgrade	~4-6 weeks per intersection
Bus bulbout*	~3 weeks per corner (includes concrete curing time)
Pedestrian bulbout*	~5-10 days per corner
Enhanced median refuge	~3-5 days per refuge
Concrete roadway base	~2-5 days per block
Bus stop concrete (bus pad)	~11-15 days per bus stop (includes concrete curing time)
Curb ramp	~3-5 days per corner
Curb-to-curb re-paving	~1 day to grind and 1 day to pave, per block
<i>*Note: some bulbouts require drainage work beforehand which typically takes ~3-5 days per location.</i>	
<i>General note: construction will be sequenced to occur at multiple locations at once to expedite work</i>

Other updates

- As a part of recent review of overall transit performance trends, 38R Geary Rapid identified as the #1 best performing Muni line for headway adherence for May 2025 (93%)!
- Geary team joined Sept 18 Heart of the Richmond Night Market to share information about upcoming Geary construction phase



7. Geary Boulevard Improvement Project update

Other updates

- AB 413, California daylighting law went into effect on January 1, 2025. Makes it illegal to park within 20 feet of the approach of any marked or unmarked crosswalk, with some exceptions
- SFMTA has decided to only issue citations for cars parked within 20 feet if the curb is painted red.
- SFMTA is moving forward painting red curb at locations that do not yet have 20 feet painted.
- Along the Geary corridor, this could result in:
 - Parking spaces removed near Geary schools before the end of 2025
 - Parking spaces removed along other parts of Geary in 2026 in coordination with underway construction
