Indigenous Peoples Day Holiday Muni Service

Monday, Oct. 13 (Indigenous Peoples Day Holiday), Muni will operate on a weekend schedule.

Parking Enforcement on Indigenous Peoples Day Holiday

Monday, Oct. 13 (Indigenous Peoples Day Holiday), parking meters (all meters including color capped), white zones, nightly street sweeping (street cleaning) and safety violations (no stopping, no parking, red and blue zones) will be enforced.

Other SFMTA parking programs will not be enforced:

- Residential Parking Permits (RPP) Zones
- General Parking Time Limits
- Weekday Daytime Street Sweeping (Street Cleaning)
- Commuter Shuttle Towaway Zones
- Unmetered Yellow and Green Zones

Parking Enforcement on Indigenous Peoples Day Holiday continued

Vehicles creating a hazard and/or an unsafe condition (i.e. double parking, blocking a bike lane, blocking driveways, blocking crosswalks, fire hydrants, etc.) are subject to receiving citations and can possibly be towed.

Note: Parking meters in the city are enforced Monday through Saturday with exception of the following areas where parking meters are enforced seven days per week throughout the year except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day:

- Parking meters in the Fisherman's Wharf area
- On and near The Embarcadero roadway
- In the Special Event Area around AT&T Park
- Four metered off-street parking facilities listed below:
 - o 8th Avenue at Clement Street
 - o 9th Avenue at Clement Street
 - o Geary Boulevard at 21st Avenue
 - o 18th Avenue at Geary Boulevard

Some parking garages (notably Pierce Street Garage between Lombard and Chestnut streets) are paid parking, 24/7 including all holidays.

Dreamforce Convention

Sunday, Oct. 5, through Sunday, Oct. 19: A street closure of Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets will be required for the Dreamforce Convention beginning at midnight, Sunday, Oct. 5 and continuing through 10 p.m., Sunday, Oct. 19.

Sunday, Oct. 12: Beginning at 10 p.m., the closure of eastern half of 4th Street between Mission and Folsom streets will be enforced.

Monday, Oct. 13 through Thursday, Oct. 16: During these dates, from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m., each day:

- NO traffic will be allowed on 4th Street between Mission and Howard streets, except Muni buses and shuttles
- Vehicle access to Howard Street between 5th and 4th streets and to 4th Street between Howard and Folsom streets will be via Howard Street at 5th Street

Tuesday, Oct. 14, through Thursday, Oct. 16: The Salesforce Corporation will be holding its yearly Dreamforce Convention at the Moscone Center. Conference hours will be from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day. An attendance of 30,000 is expected at Moscone Center North, South and West. Dreamforce Convention continued

Significant traffic congestion is anticipated in and around Moscone Center between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily for the duration of the closure, particularly on streets immediately east of 3rd Street. Additional congestion on 4th Street from Market Street and on Mission Street between 3rd and on 4th Streets is anticipated from early morning through the evening between Monday, Oct. 13 and Thursday, Oct. 16. Travelers are encouraged to take public transportation or use alternate routes. There will be heavy pedestrian traffic in the area.

From Sunday, Oct. 5 through Sunday, Oct. 19, Howard Street traffic will be detoured via southbound 2nd Street to Harrison Street, or via New Montgomery Street to Hawthorne Street to either Folsom or Harrison streets.

There will be a signed bicycle detour for people on bikes on Howard Street to turn north at 2nd Street to Market Street. People on bikes who wish to stay on Howard Street will have the option to dismount at Howard and 3rd streets and walk their bicycle through the event along the north sidewalk.

Signage will be placed in advance of the street closures and detour routes.

Caltrans will activate electronic message signs on major freeways entering the city to notify motorists of the closures.

SFMTA Parking Control Officers and San Francisco Police Officers will be deployed at key intersections throughout the closures.

There will be no impact on Muni service.

There will be temporary taxi stands for **pick up and drop off only**:

- White Zone at W Hotel, north side of Howard Street between 3rd Street and Hawthorne Street
- White Zone at Intercontinental, north side of Howard Street at 5th Street
- Southside of Howard Street (westbound) between 4th and 5th streets

Street Closures

Jefferson Street between Hyde Street and westerly terminus will be closed from 6 a.m., Friday, Oct. 10 to 10 p.m., Sunday, Oct. 12.

Supplemental Muni Service

To accommodate the crowds for these events, SFMTA will provide supplemental service on the F Market & Wharves line during the time specified:

From 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., each day, Friday, Oct. 10 through Sunday, Oct. 12

- **F Market & Wharves** line will be supplemented by F-line shuttle buses to and from Embarcadero Station and Fisherman's Wharf.
- **49 Van Ness/Mission** route will be supplemented with additional buses between Van Ness/Market and Van Ness/North Point.
- **28 19**th **Avenue** route will be supplemented with additional buses between Daly City BART and Van Ness/North Point

Taxi Stands

Taxi stands to allow taxis to service the event are at the following locations:

- Beach and Hyde streets
- Pier 39

Traffic congestion and disruption of transit service is expected in the northern section of the city after the Fleet Week Air Shows.

Traffic coming into San Francisco is anticipated to be congested. Parking will be limited. BART, Ferries, AC Transit and SamTrans are alternate transportation options. The SFMTA encourages event participants to take public transit, taxis, bike or walk to the event.

Riders traveling via BART should transfer at the Embarcadero Station and take an F Market train or a bus to Fisherman's Wharf.

Event at Chase Center

Thursday, Oct. 9 through Sunday, Oct. 12: There will be multiple events to be held at the Chase Center:

- **Thursday, Oct. 9:** The Warriors will host <u>Open Practice</u> presented by Waymo. Show will begin at 5:30 p.m. Doors will open at 5 p.m.
- **Friday, Oct. 10:** Performance by <u>Playboi Carti</u> will take place. The show will start at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 6 p.m.
- **Saturday, Oct. 11:** First Performance by <u>Dua Lipa</u> will take place. The show will start at 7:30 p.m. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m.
- **Sunday, Oct. 12:** Second performance by <u>Dua Lipa</u> will take place. The show will start at 7:30 p.m. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m.

Muni will provide supplement 78X Arena Express service:

- Pre-event express shuttle service from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other area major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 1) 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 2) Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 3) Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after the event.

Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, NO PARKING will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.

Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

- Intersection: Grant Avenue and Commercial Street

All other intersections will remain open.

The night market has expanded onto Waverly Place. A street closure of Waverly Place between Sacramento and Washington streets will be in place from 1 to 10 p.m.

There will be no impact on Muni service.

Larkin Street Roadway Shared Space

Saturday, Oct. 11: The Tenderloin Lower Polk Merchants and Property Owners Association will host their monthly Roadway Shared Space on Larkin Street.

Larkin Street between Eddy and O'Farrell streets will be closed from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 11.

The **19 Polk** Muni route will be rerouted.

San Francisco Lowrider Cold Frisco Nights

Italian Heritage Parade

Sunday, Oct. 12: The annual Italian Heritage Day Parade will be held in North Beach and Fisherman's Wharf beginning at 12:30 p.m. from Jefferson and Powell streets and proceed to Washington Square. The parade should last two and a half hours. For event details, visit sfitalianheritage.org.

The parade formation will require the following street closures, beginning at 7:30 a.m.:

- Powell Street between Chestnut and Beach streets
- Stockton Street between Bay and Beach streets
- Beach Street between Mason and Stockton streets
- North Point Street between Mason Street and The Embarcadero
- Francisco Street between Stockton and Mason streets
- Powell Street between Lombard and Filbert streets

The parade route will begin on Jefferson Street at Mason Street, proceed west on Jefferson Street, south on Leavenworth Street, south on Columbus Avenue, south on Stockton Street, east on Vallejo Street, north on Columbus Avenue, north on Stockton Street, east on to Filbert Street and past the review stands at Washington Square Park. Parade units will disburse on Powell Street. Traffic along the parade route will be closed until the parade clears.

The following Muni lines and routes will be affected and re-routed: Powell-Mason Cable Car; F Market & Wharves; 8 Bayshore; 28 19th Avenue; 30 Stockton; 39 Coit and 45 Union/Stockton. Parking is very limited in the North Beach neighborhood.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements

Now until 2027: Replacement work of sewer and water lines is currently taking place along Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street. Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated nearby. Riders should look for orange signage at impacted bus stops.

ONGOING: Sewer Replacement and Street Reconstruction in the Wharf Area

Now through Mid-October: As part of this work, bus stops will be relocated and some bus lines will be rerouted. The work area is Powell Street between Jefferson and North Point streets, and, on North Point Street between Mason and Powell streets.
