BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Approving various routine parking and traffic modifications.

SUMMARY:

- The SFMTA Board of Directors has authority to adopt parking and traffic regulations changes.
- Taxis are not exempt from any of these regulations.
- The proposed parking and traffic modifications have been reviewed pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- The proposed action is the Approval Action for Items A-D as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.

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PURPOSE

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- 4. Make streets safer for everyone.
- 5. Deliver reliable and equitable transportation services.
- 6. Eliminate pollution and greenhouse gas emissions by increasing use of transit, walking, and bicycling.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

ITEMS

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on September 5, 2025

A. RESCIND – PART-TIME BUS ZONE, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, 6 AM TO 7 PM Jackson Street, north side, from 125 feet to 162 feet west of Fillmore Street (Requested by SFMTA).

Modification A would remove a 37-foot-long part-time bus zone extension in effect from 6 AM to 7 PM, Monday through Friday and restore approximately 2 residential permit parking spaces.

B. RESCIND – 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT FOR VEHICLES WITH AREA G PERMITS, ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Bush Street, north side, from Fillmore Street to 110 feet westerly, Bush Street, south side, from 20 feet to 150 feet west of Fillmore Street (Requested by SFMTA).

Modification B would convert residential permit parking into general metered parking to address parking availability issues on Fillmore Street.

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- C. ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, San Bruno Avenue, east side, from 20 feet south of Division Street to Alameda Street, San Bruno Avenue, west side, from 20 feet north of Alameda Street to Division Street (Requested by SFMTA).
 - Modification C would establish metered parking to improve turnover for adjacent businesses and promote consistency of parking regulations on adjacent streets.
- D. ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Utah Street, east side, from 20 feet south of Alameda Street to 15th Street (Requested by SFMTA).

Modification D would install parking meters to address parking availability and promote consistency in curb regulations on this block. Note: time limits for existing metered parking on Utah Street, west side will change from 4-hour to No Time Limit for consistency and programming purposes.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the San Francisco Planning Department, has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Items A-D (Case No. 2025-007983ENV, August 22, 2025) are categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The proposed action is the Approval Action for Items A-D as defined by San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31.

- A. RESCIND PART-TIME BUS ZONE, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, 6 AM TO 7 PM Jackson Street, north side, from 125 feet to 162 feet west of Fillmore Street.
- B. RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT FOR VEHICLES WITH AREA G PERMITS, ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Bush Street, north side, from Fillmore Street to 110 feet westerly, Bush Street, south side, from 20 feet to 150 feet west of Fillmore Street.
- C. ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, San Bruno Avenue, east side, from 20 feet south of Division Street to Alameda Street, San Bruno Avenue, west side, from 20 feet north of Alameda Street to Division Street.
- D. ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Utah Street, east side, from 20 feet south of Alameda Street to 15th Street.

WHEREAS, The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the San Francisco Planning Department, has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Items A-D (Case No. 2025-007983ENV, August 22, 2025) are categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed action is the Approval Action for Items A-D as defined by San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department by Case Number at https://sfplanninggis.org/pim/ or 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and are incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, The public has been notified about the proposed modifications and has been given the opportunity to comment on those modifications through the public hearing process; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The SFMTA Board of Directors adopts these CEQA findings as its own; a copy of the CEQA findings and the CEQA determinations are on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at https://sfplanning.org/ and 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the Director of Transportation and the Director of the Streets Division approves the changes.
