Griffin Lee thanked service workers and front-line staff for work during the holidays and the outages and expressed interest in understanding more about the parcel tax.

Jackson Nutt-Beers shared that the parcel tax package is a product of hard work and collaboration and looked forward to working together.

Terrance Hall expressed support for the parcel tax.

Judson True, Chief of Staff and Director of External Affairs, and Jillian Johnson, Director of Finance Administration, presented the item.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

John Roberts expressed concern about aging infrastructure, maintenance needs, and the agency's larger structure.

Tom Radulovich shared about the Transit Effectiveness project and efficiencies to be gained if Muni sped up.

Speaker thanked staff for the presentation and encouraged the agency to continue doing the hard work for speed and efficiency of the system.

Speaker urged the agency to improve service and reliability and expressed support for increasing investment to match our growing city.

Director Heminger requested more information including 10-year data on work orders to better understand whether efficiencies could be gained.



12. Authorizing the Director of Transportation to execute the Tenth Amendment to Contract No. SFMTA-2016-17, Paratransit Broker and Operating Agreement, with Transdev Services, Inc., to extend the Contract for a two-year period, increase the not to exceed amount by \$30,831,549 for a total Contract amount not to exceed \$339,102,572, and fund the extended term, subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors under Charter Section 9.118; and recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the Tenth Amendment pursuant to that authority. California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
