Event at Chase Center

Friday, Jan. 30 to Tuesday, Feb. 3: There will be ball games at the Chase Center:

- **Friday, Jan. 30:** The Warriors will host a home game against the [Detroit Pistons](#). Game will begin at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m.
- **Tuesday, Feb. 3:** The Warriors will host a home game against the [Philadelphia 76ers](#). Game will begin at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m.

Muni will provide supplement 78X Arena Express service:

- *Pre-event express shuttle service from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.*
- *Post-event express shuttle service from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the clears.*

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 1) 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 2) Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 3) Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after the event.

Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, **NO PARKING** will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.

Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

San Francisco Half Marathon

Sunday, Feb. 1: The annual San Francisco Half Marathon, 10K and 5K will take place in Golden Gate Park. The 5K starts at 8:00 a.m. and traverses a point-to-point course within the park. The Half Marathon and 10K begin at 8 a.m. and head out to the Panhandle, back into the park, with the Half Marathon continuing out the Great Highway to the Zoo and back. All races finish near the corner of MLK and Bernice Rodgers. For more event details, visit San Francisco Half Marathon.

The following street closures will be required from 7:15 to 10 a.m. Each street will be reopened as the last runner goes through:

- Oak Street between Stanyan and Broderick streets
- Fell Street between Stanyan and Broderick streets
- Baker Street between Hayes and Page streets
- Masonic Street between Hayes and Haight streets
- Stanyan Street between Hayes and Haight streets
- Kezar Drive between Stanyan Street and Lincoln Way

Both northbound and southbound Great Highway between Fulton Street and Sloat Boulevard will be closed from 6 a.m. to noon.

The following Muni routes will be affected: **18 46th Avenue; 33 Ashbury/18th; 43 Masonic; and 44 O'Shaughnessy**

NEW: Super Bowl Experience from Tuesday, Feb. 3 to Saturday, Feb. 7

Super Bowl Experience will take place from Tuesday, Feb. 3 to Saturday, Feb. 7 at the Moscone Center. There will be street closures and traffic detours in the areas surrounding Union Square and in SoMa near the Moscone Center. From late night Friday, Jan. 30 through early morning Tuesday, Feb. 10, Howard, Mission, and 4th streets will experience rolling street closures. Local access and Muni service will be maintained.

Street Closures

There will be numerous street closures and traffic restrictions during the lead-up to Super Bowl week. To help with trip planning needs, listed below are planned street closures in and around the event areas:

SoMa Closures

The following street closures will take effect from 6 a.m., Friday, Jan. 30 to 6 a.m., Tuesday, Feb. 10:

- Howard Street between 3rd and 4th streets; the southern-most travel lane and the south parking lane between Hawthorne and 3rd streets
- Folsom Street (northern-most travel lane and north parking lane) between Mabini and 3rd streets
- 3rd Street (two western-most parking or travel lanes) between Harrison and Stevenson streets
- 4th Street (two eastern-most parking or travel lanes) between Market and Folsom streets
- Jessie East Street between Mission and Jessie streets
- Jessie Street between Jessie East and 4th streets

The following street closures will take effect from 10 p.m., Saturday, Jan. 31 to 6 a.m., Tuesday, Feb. 10 (Muni and local access will be allowed on 4th Street during the closure hours):

- 4th Street (two western-most right turn lanes) between Minna and Howard streets
- Minna Street between 4th Street and the InterContinental driveway
- Howard Street (north parking lane) between 4th and 5th streets

- 4th Street between Market and Howard streets
- Howard Street between 4th and 5th streets (**Local access will be allowed from 5th at Howard Street**)

The following street closure will take effect daily, between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m., from Monday, Feb. 2, to Sunday, Feb. 8:

- Mission Street between 3rd and 5th streets (**Muni and local access will be allowed**)

The following street closure will take effect from 10 a.m., Thursday, Feb. 5, to 2 p.m., Monday, Feb. 9:

- Minna Street between New Montgomery and 3rd street (**Local access will be allowed from New Montgomery Street**)

The following street closure will take effect from 8 a.m., Friday, Feb. 6, to 2 p.m., Monday, Feb. 9:

- Jessie Street between New Montgomery and Annie streets

Traffic Detours

Along with street closures, there will be several other traffic detours and restrictions during the event. Muni WILL NOT be impacted.

- Southbound travel restricted daily, all day, from Saturday, Jan. 31 until Sunday, Feb. 8
 - Stockton Street at Post Street
 - Stockton Street at O'Farrell Street
- Only local access will be allowed, from Saturday, Jan. 31 until Sunday, Feb. 8
 - Ellis Street between Stockton and Cyril Magnin streets
 - Stockton Street between Post and Ellis streets
- Local access will be accommodated via a temporary Howard Street eastbound lane, from northbound 5th Street, between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. daily, from Saturday, Jan. 31 until Sunday, Feb. 8
 - Howard between 4th and 5th streets
 - 4th Street between Howard and Folsom streets

- Only local access will be allowed, from Monday, Feb. 2 until Sunday, Feb. 8:
 - Mission Street between 4th and 5th streets
- Only local access will be allowed, from Thursday, Feb. 5 until Monday, Feb. 9
 - Minna Street between 3rd and New Montgomery streets
- Only local access will be allowed from Friday, Feb. 6 until Monday, Feb. 9
 - Jessie Street between Mission and 4th streets
 - Jessie East Street between Mission and 4th streets

Taste of the NFL at The Hibernia

The following street closures will take effect from 11 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 5, to 7 a.m., Sunday, Feb. 8:

- Jones Street between McAllister Street and Golden Gate Avenue
- McAllister Street (westbound travel and parking lanes) between Jones and 7th streets

There will be minor reroutes around the area of the event on the following Muni routes: 5 Fulton; 5R Fulton Rapid and 27 Bryant.

Extra Muni Subway Service

There will be extra S Shuttle service on Market Street between West Portal and Embarcadero stations during these times:

- Between 3 and 11 p.m., daily, Tuesday, Feb. 3 and Wednesday Feb. 4
- Between 3 p.m. and midnight, daily, from Thursday, Feb. 5 to Saturday Feb. 7
- Between 3 p.m., Saturday, Feb. 7 and 12:30 a.m., Sunday, Feb. 8, 2-car trains will operate on the K Ingleside and M Ocean View lines

There will be extra S Shuttle service for the Central Subway (between Chinatown and Mission Bay) during these on times:

- Between 3 and 11 p.m., Tuesday, Feb. 3
- Between 3 and 11 p.m., Wednesday, Feb. 4

There will be extra S Shuttle service for the Central Subway (between Chinatown to Marin Street) during these times:

- Between 3 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 5 until and 12:30 a.m., Friday, Feb. 6
- Between 3 p.m., Friday, Feb. 6 until 1:30 a.m., Saturday, Feb. 7
- Between 3 p.m., Saturday, Feb. 7 until 12:30 a.m., Sunday, Feb. 8

NEW: Transbay Howard Streetscape Project – Road Construction

Feb. 2026 through 2028: As a part of the Transbay Howard Streetscape Project, new safety upgrades, traffic signal infrastructure, landscaping and a protected two-way bicycle lane are being built on Howard Street between The Embarcadero and 4th Street.

Due to work at multiple sites, expect intermittent delays and lane closures on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Drivers should exercise caution near construction zones, follow posted detour signage, and consider using alternate routes. During major events and conventions, work will be paused near Moscone Center.

UPDATE: Caltrans Work—04-4K1104 (19th Avenue)

Phase 1 (Concrete Parking Strip Work) was completed. Inspection and some electrical work will be conducted over the next three weeks. Once complete, the contractor will demobilize and will return until May/June 2026 to perform paving work.

UPDATE: Bridge Rehabilitation of Central (US 101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts

The Bridge Rehabilitation of the Central (US-101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts is a vital project to strengthen and rehabilitate the viaducts which are 71-years old. To facilitate the project, ramp closures are scheduled throughout the project.

Caltrans has not provided the SFMTA with information about planned closures for this project for the week, from Jan. 26 to Feb. 2.

ONGOING: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements

Now until 2027: Replacement work of sewer and water lines is currently taking place along Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street. Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated nearby. Riders should look for orange signage at impacted bus stops.

Muni Service Changes Begin on Saturday, Feb. 14

Beginning on Saturday, Feb. 14, the SFMTA will be making Muni service changes. There will be several changes to bus stops and routes to improve reliability, provide better connections to regional transit and avoid delays and to improve Muni for years to come. Crews are working to replace Potrero Yard with a modern bus maintenance facility through the [Potrero Yard Modernization Project](#).

Below are changes scheduled to begin on Saturday, Feb. 14:

More Reliable Schedules

- **1X California Express:** The buses that now leave the first stop at 33rd Avenue & Geary Boulevard at 7:45 a.m. and 8 a.m. will now leave at 7:40 a.m. and 7:55 a.m. This change will allow better spacing for 1 California buses.
- **54 Felton and 57 Parkmerced:** The SFMTA is making slight changes to the schedules for these routes. This will allow customers to better connect with BART.
- **Late-night Owl service:** The SFMTA are updating these schedules to more accurately reflect trip times.

Changes to Bus Frequency

- **5 Fulton and 5R Fulton Rapid:** With the closing of the Potrero Division, there will be a mix of 40' and 60' buses on the 5 Fulton and 5R Fulton Rapid. To provide enough Muni service to meet demand, the 5 Fulton bus will arrive every seven minutes on weekends instead of every 10 minutes. The 5R Fulton Rapid bus will arrive every eight minutes instead of every ten minutes during busy times on weekdays. The SFMTA will monitor this frequency change and address crowding as needed.
- **14 Mission:** To provide Muni service where it is needed most, the 14 Mission will run every eight minutes instead of every seven minutes on weekends. The SFMTA is making this change since more riders are choosing to ride the 14R Mission Rapid at these times. The SFMTA will also monitor this change to address crowding as needed.

Bus Stop Changes

- **1 California and 1X California Express:** The inbound (toward downtown) stop on the 1 California and 1X California Express at [California Street & 4th Avenue](#) will move across the intersection. To improve reliability and traffic safety, buses will stop at a new transit bulb after the traffic light.

Bus Stop Changes *continued*

- **6 Hayes-Parnassus:** On days when Hayes Street is closed to cars between Gough and Laguna streets, the 6 Hayes-Parnassus bus will continue to use Grove Street. This may not be reflected on trip-planning apps (e.g. Google Maps). This change will make trip-planning apps more accurate on weekends when Hayes Street is open to traffic.
- **15 Hunters Point Express:** To improve transfers to Union Square/Market Street station, a new stop is added at Stockton & Geary streets in Union Square for trips heading toward the Bayview.
- **48 Quintara-24th Street:** The outbound route (toward Ocean Beach) will match the inbound route between Portola and Ulloa streets. The 48 Quintara-24th Street will travel on Claremont Boulevard instead of Vicente Street & West Portal Avenue and will no longer stop at [Vicente Street & West Portal Avenue](#). This change will avoid congestion on West Portal Avenue and Vicente Streets.
- **58 Parkmerced:** To improve bus reliability and travel time, three stops for the 58 Parkmerced route will be relocated to use new boarding islands on Lake Merced Boulevard:
 - Inbound direction (toward Stonestown): Bus stop at [Lake Merced & Lake Merced Hills Boulevard](#) will be relocated from the sidewalk to a new boarding island in the street.
 - Inbound direction (toward Stonestown): Bus stop at [1100 Lake Merced Boulevard](#) will be relocated about 350 feet south to a new boarding island near the crosswalk at John Muir Drive.
 - Outbound direction (toward Daly City BART): Bus stop at [1100 Lake Merced Boulevard](#) will also be relocated about 350 feet south to a new boarding island near John Muir Drive.
