San Francisco—The San FRANCISCO Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) releases the following upcoming event-related traffic and transit impacts for the week, from Thursday, May 28 through Wednesday, June 3, 2026.

Event at Chase Center

Thursday, May 28 through Tuesday, June 2: There will be multiple ball games at the Chase Center:

- **Thursday, May 28:** Golden State Valkyries will play against the [Indiana Fever](#). The game will start at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m.
- **Sunday, May 31:** Golden State Valkyries will play against the [Las Vegas Aces](#). The game will start at 12:30 p.m. Doors will open at 11 a.m.
- **Tuesday, June 2:** Golden State Valkyries will play against the [Portland Fires](#). The game will start at 7 p.m. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m.

Muni will provide supplement 78X Arena Express service:

- *Pre-event express shuttle service* from 16th Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16th Street to 16th Street BART Station will run until the clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 1) 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 2) Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 3) Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after the event.

Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, NO PARKING will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Between the 500 and 700 blocks of Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB)

Taxi Stands

There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.

Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way at Bridgeview Way.

Other pickup/drop-off locations near Chase Center

- 4th Street, which connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.
- Owens Street, which also connects to Chase Center via the Gene Friend Way pedestrian path on the UCSF campus.

Motorists traveling to and from the ceremonies should expect heavy traffic around the event areas. Congestion and heavy traffic on Frederick Street between Stanyan Street and Lincoln Way are anticipated.

NEW: Citywide Muni Service Changes

Starting Saturday, June 6, Muni will make service changes across San Francisco. These changes aim to improve reliability, reduce crowding and make trips more consistent for riders. These Muni service changes are cost neutral.

Several routes will receive schedule adjustments to improve spacing between buses and reduce delays. To respond to crowding, the SFMTA is also adding targeted late-night service to these routes: 14 Mission and 14 Owl.

There will be additional updates which include:

- Stop changes on the following bus routes: 35 Eureka and 48 Quintara/24th Street
- Reliability improvements on the T Third
- New stop locations tied to the Lake Merced Quick Build Project

NEW: Citywide Muni Service Changes *continued*

These changes are based on rider feedback, operator input and service data. Due to the SFMTA's [budget gap](#), we cannot increase overall Muni service. Without new funding sources, the SFMTA would have to make significant cuts to Muni service. It could mean eliminating one-third of service. UPDATE: Mobile Payment Options and Parking Spots Reservation

To make parking in San Francisco easier and more convenient, the SFMTA is now offering more options for paying at meters and reserving parking spots in advance, whether you are driving to work, an event or a night out.

Two new mobile options—ParkMobile and HotSpot—are now available for paying for metered parking in San Francisco. With these apps, drivers can receive payment reminders, extend parking time remotely, and manage parking payment effortlessly from their mobile phone. Customers may also continue to pay with cash or card.

The SFMTA also introduced an online reservation system for reserving a parking space at most city-owned garages up to six months in advance. This system was originally launched at the Civic Center and Performing Arts Garages for special events, it is now available at the majority of the 22 SFMTA garages citywide. PayByPhone has been phased out and is no longer available for payment at city-owned parking meters in San Francisco. UPDATE: 13th Street Safety Project

Now until 2027: The 13th Street Safety Project is currently under construction to deliver new traffic safety improvements on 13th Street and Duboce Avenue between Folsom and Valencia streets, including protected bike lanes, sidewalk extensions, traffic signal upgrades, accessibility upgrades, sewer upgrades, repaving, and parking/loading changes.

Crews will work at multiple locations over the course of construction, with intermittent lane impacts, traffic shifts, and parking restrictions. Road users should use caution near crews, follow posted signage, and plan for extra travel time when moving through the corridor:

- **13th Street at South Van Ness Avenue (Division Circle Navigation Center frontage):** Crews are building a new sidewalk segment and a separated bike lane channel. During this work, only one eastbound right-turn lane is available from 13th Street to southbound South Van Ness Avenue. When construction is complete, both eastbound right-turn lanes will reopen. Anticipated restoration: mid-June 2026
- **Duboce Avenue at Otis Street /Mission Street:** Work is underway on new curb ramps and a refresh of the north side median island. Two southbound left-turn lanes from Otis Street to eastbound 13th Street will remain open during construction. Drivers continuing southbound through the intersection should use the bus-only lane as signed. Once the island work is complete, the intersection will return to two southbound left-turn lanes, one general traffic lane, and one bus-only lane. Anticipated restoration: early to mid-June 2026

UPDATE: Cable Car Sheaves

On Wednesday, June 3, crews will finish the final phase of restoring the Cable Car sheave at the Powell and Market streets turnaround. The sheave is a massive, grooved wheel that guides the underground cables through specialized pulley systems. The work on June 3 will focus on replacing the existing sheave with one that has been refurbished.

UPDATE: Cable Car Sheaves *continued*

This work will only affect the Powell Street segment of the Cable Car system, where buses will substitute Cable Car service from Ellis to Jackson streets. Riders can transfer to the Hyde and Mason streets lines. The California Street Cable Car line will not be affected.

UPDATE: 04-0X5804 Install Roadside Signs and Pavement Delineation

Caltrans contractors will be closing off-ramps overnight to install roadway signs and pavement markings.

- Westbound I-80 Macalla Road between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- Southbound I-280 John Daly Boulevard (Daly City) between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m.
- Southbound I-280 Monterey Boulevard between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m.

Friday, May 29 to Saturday, May 30, overnight

- Westbound I-80 Macalla Road between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- Southbound I-280 John Daly Boulevard (Daly City) between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m.
- Southbound I-280 Monterey Boulevard between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m.

UPDATE:I-80 SFO Bay Bridge West Span Paint Project

Since Tuesday, April 7, Caltrans crews have been implementing overnight lane closures on the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge west span to repaint the west span of the bridge for this preservation project. Other work, such as cable and joint rehabilitation may be performed during these lane closures as well. One to three lanes will be closed from Sunday nights to Friday mornings, between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. The bridge will not be closed for this work; crews will set up containment around the work areas and traffic control will be in place. This work will require several months to complete but schedules are dependent on weather conditions.

UPDATE: San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge Joint Rehabilitation Project

To facilitate the project, there are ramp closures scheduled throughout the project.

Eastbound I-80 SFOBB On-Ramp Nightly Closures

Caltrans is implementing temporary eastbound I-80 on-ramp closures to the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge during Thursday through Sunday nighttime hours. Detours will be clearly posted, motorists are advised to allow extra travel time and use alternate routes when possible.

The Essex Street and bus on-ramps will be closed overnight between 11:59 p.m. and 7 a.m. on the following days: **1)** Sunday May 31; **2)** Monday June 1; **3)** Tuesday June 2; **4)** Wednesday June 3; and **5)** Thursday June 4.

UPDATE: Caltrans Work—04-4K1104 (19th Avenue)

Phase 2 (Paving Work): Caltrans completed paving 19th Avenue between Lincoln Way and Holloway. Pavement delineation work will continue overnight between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m., Monday through Friday. During pavement delineation work, two lanes will be closed and one will be open on a rolling basis.

UPDATE: Caltrans Project —108204 US 101 Hospital Curve Pave and Median Contract

During construction hours, the far-left lanes on US-101, both northbound and southbound, will be closed. This work requires cutting existing concrete barrier segments so they can be removed and replaced with the new barrier. Residents and motorists, particularly those near the Cesar Chavez exit at the US-101/I-280 split, should expect significant noise during the barrier-cutting operations.

UPDATE: Bridge Rehabilitation of Central (US 101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts

The Bridge Rehabilitation of the Central (US-101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts is a vital project to strengthen and rehabilitate the viaducts which are 71-years old. To facilitate the project, ramp closures are scheduled throughout the project.

Caltrans anticipates a 55-hour closure of westbound I-80 between 4th Street and US-101 in early August 2026.

SFMTA Parking Control Officers will be deployed along key detour routes during street closures.

ONGOING: Transbay Howard Streetscape Project – Road Construction

Feb. 2026 through 2028: As a part of the Transbay Howard Streetscape Project, new safety upgrades, traffic signal infrastructure, landscaping and a protected two-way bicycle lane are being built on Howard Street between The Embarcadero and 4th Street.

Due to work at multiple sites, expect intermittent delays and lane closures on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Drivers should exercise caution near construction zones, follow posted detour signage, and consider using alternate routes. During major events and conventions, work will be paused near Moscone Center.

ONGOING: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements

Now until 2027: Replacement work of sewer and water lines is currently taking place along Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street. Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated nearby. Riders should look for orange signage at impacted bus stops.
