MINUTES OF THE APRIL 23, 2026, MEETING (ACTION ITEM)

The Committee adopted the Minutes.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Barry Taranto inquired about changes to ISCOTT procedure from recent legislation passed by the Board of Supervisors.

Richard [no last name given] asked that the committee enforce permit conditions for the regular recurring permitted closure on the 400 block of Hayes Street.

“M” provided written comment to an item on the consent calendar: We understand this item is proceeding on consent, so we’ll keep this brief. Our concern has consistently been that this recurring year-long use is being added onto a corridor already operating under an unresolved Shared Spaces closure, without a coordinated evaluation of cumulative corridor impacts. A temporary pause was requested to allow for broader stakeholder engagement and corridor-level review, and we wanted those concerns preserved in the record. Also worth noting that we did receive confirmation that the farmers market is open to hosting the market at another location so the process that led up to this approval was seemingly flawed since many stakeholders were not included.

These proposed actions are an Approval Action as defined by S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by ISCOTT, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.
