### **Sikh Parade and Festival**

### **PTO San Francisco Stop at the Escape From Alcatraz Triathlon**

**Saturday, June 6:** The annual “Escape from Alcatraz Triathlon” on Sunday will be preceded by another triathlon being put on in conjunction with the Professional Triathletes Organization (PTO). The PTO Triathlon is equivalent to the PGA, LPGA and ATP, a membership-based organization of the World.

The race will begin at 6 a.m. on the City Cruises ship in the San Francisco Bay between the piers and the island of Alcatraz with 2K (1.2M) swim to the Marina Green Beach adjacent to the St. Francis Yacht Club. The 80K (50M) bike course will be five loops going out the Presidio making a turnaround on El Camino Del Mar at 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The 18K (11M) run course will have three loops between the Marina Green and the Warming Hut.

**The following street closures will be required from 3 to 11 a.m., Saturday, though lifted as quickly as possible as the race passes through, local access is being maintained:**

- El Camino Del Mar between Lincoln Hwy (Land’s End/Legion of Honor and The Presidio)
- 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> avenues between El Camino Del Mar and Lake Street
- 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Lake Street and McLaren Avenue
- McLaren Avenue between El Camino Del Mar and 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue
- Marina Boulevard between Lyon and Fillmore streets

### ***Street Closures***

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> streets to vehicle traffic. King Street will reopen after first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets

**Tuesday, June 9:** There will be a ball game at the Chase Center:

### ***Muni will provide supplement 78X Arena Express service:***

- *Pre-event express shuttle service* from 16<sup>th</sup> Street BART Station to Chase Center will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- *Post-event express shuttle service* from Chase Center on 16<sup>th</sup> Street to 16<sup>th</sup> Street BART Station will run until the clears.

### ***Special Event Parking Rates***

During basketball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$12 per hour. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. ### ***Street Closures***

**To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:**

- 2) Warriors Way between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- 3) Northbound 3<sup>rd</sup> Street between 16<sup>th</sup> Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after the event.

Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16<sup>th</sup> streets.

### ***No Parking Zone***

## **CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES**

### **NEW: Citywide Muni Service Changes**

**Starting Saturday, June 6,** Muni will make service changes across San Francisco. These changes aim to improve reliability, reduce crowding and make trips more consistent for riders. These Muni service changes are cost neutral.

Several routes will receive schedule adjustments to improve spacing between buses and reduce delays. To respond to crowding, the SFMTA is also adding targeted late-night service to these routes: 14 Mission and 14 Owl.

There will be additional updates which include:

- Stop changes on the following bus routes: 35 Eureka and 48 Quintara/24<sup>th</sup> Street
- Reliability improvements on the T Third
- New stop locations tied to the Lake Merced Quick Build Project

### NEW: Citywide Muni Service Changes *continued*

These changes are based on rider feedback, operator input and service data. Due to the SFMTA's [budget gap](#), we cannot increase overall Muni service. Without new funding sources, the SFMTA would have to make significant cuts to Muni service. It could mean eliminating one-third of service. ### **UPDATE: I-80 SFO Bay Bridge West Span Paint Project**

**Since Tuesday, April 7**, Caltrans crews have been implementing overnight lane closures on the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge west span to repaint the west span of the bridge for this preservation project. Other work, such as cable and joint rehabilitation may be performed during these lane closures as well. One to three lanes will be closed from Sunday nights to Friday mornings, between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. The bridge will not be closed for this work; crews will set up containment around the work areas and traffic control will be in place. This work will require several months to complete but schedules are dependent on weather conditions.

### **UPDATE: San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge Joint Rehabilitation Project**

To facilitate the project, there are ramp closures scheduled throughout the project.

#### ***Eastbound I-80 SFOBB On-Ramp Nightly Closures***

Caltrans is implementing temporary eastbound I-80 on-ramp closures to the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge during Thursday through Sunday nighttime hours. Detours will be clearly posted, motorists are advised to allow extra travel time and use alternate routes when possible.

**UPDATE: Caltrans Work—04-4K1104 (19<sup>th</sup> Avenue)**

**Phase 2 (Paving Work):** Caltrans completed paving 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Lincoln Way and Holloway. Pavement delineation work will continue overnight between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m., Monday through Friday. During pavement delineation work, two lanes will be closed and one will be open on a rolling basis.

**UPDATE: Caltrans Project —108204 US 101 Hospital Curve Pave and Median Contract**

**During construction hours, the far-left lanes on US-101, both northbound and southbound, will be closed.** This work requires cutting existing concrete barrier segments so they can be removed and replaced with the new barrier. Residents and motorists, particularly those near the Cesar Chavez exit at the US-101/I-280 split, should expect significant noise during the barrier-cutting operations.

**UPDATE: Bridge Rehabilitation of Central (US 101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts**

The Bridge Rehabilitation of the Central (US-101) and Bayshore (I-80) Viaducts is a vital project to strengthen and rehabilitate the viaducts which are 71-years old. To facilitate the project, ramp closures are scheduled throughout the project.

Caltrans anticipates a 55-hour closure of westbound I-80 between 4<sup>th</sup> Street and US-101 in early August 2026.

### **ONGOING: Mobile Payment Options and Parking Spots Reservation**

To make parking in San Francisco easier and more convenient, the SFMTA is now offering more options for paying at meters and reserving parking spots in advance, whether you are driving to work, an event or a night out.

Two new mobile options—ParkMobile and HotSpot—are now available for paying for metered parking in San Francisco. With these apps, drivers can receive payment reminders, extend parking time remotely, and manage parking payment effortlessly from their mobile phone. Customers may also continue to pay with cash or card.

The SFMTA also introduced an online reservation system for reserving a parking space at most city-owned garages up to six months in advance. This system was originally launched at the Civic Center and Performing Arts Garages for special events, it is now available at the majority of the 22 SFMTA garages citywide. This convenient feature removes the hassle of searching for parking and ensures you'll have a guaranteed space. PayByPhone has been phased out and is no longer available for payment at city-owned parking meters in San Francisco. ### **ONGOING: 13th Street Safety Project**

**Now until 2027:** The 13th Street Safety Project is currently under construction to deliver new traffic safety improvements on 13th Street and Duboce Avenue between Folsom and Valencia streets, including protected bike lanes, sidewalk extensions, traffic signal upgrades, accessibility upgrades, sewer upgrades, repaving, and parking/loading changes.

Crews will work at multiple locations over the course of construction, with intermittent lane impacts, traffic shifts, and parking restrictions. Road users should use caution near crews, follow posted signage, and plan for extra travel time when moving through the corridor:

## ONGOING: 13th Street Safety Project *continued*

### Construction Work *continued*

- **13<sup>th</sup> Street at South Van Ness Avenue (Division Circle Navigation Center frontage):** Crews are building a new sidewalk segment and a separated bike lane channel. During this work, only one eastbound right-turn lane is available from 13<sup>th</sup> Street to southbound South Van Ness Avenue. When construction is complete, both eastbound right-turn lanes will reopen. Anticipated restoration: mid-June 2026
- **Duboce Avenue at Otis Street /Mission Street:** Work is underway on new curb ramps and a refresh of the north side median island. Two southbound left-turn lanes from Otis Street to eastbound 13<sup>th</sup> Street will remain open during construction. Drivers continuing southbound through the intersection should use the bus-only lane as signed. Once the island work is complete, the intersection will return to two southbound left-turn lanes, one general traffic lane, and one bus-only lane. Anticipated restoration: early to mid-June 2026

## **ONGOING: Transbay Howard Streetscape Project – Road Construction**

**Feb. 2026 through 2028:** As a part of the Transbay Howard Streetscape Project, new safety upgrades, traffic signal infrastructure, landscaping and a protected two-way bicycle lane are being built on Howard Street between The Embarcadero and 4<sup>th</sup> Street.

Due to work at multiple sites, expect intermittent delays and lane closures on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Drivers should exercise caution near construction zones, follow posted detour signage, and consider using alternate routes. During major events and conventions, work will be paused near Moscone Center.

This is a San Francisco Public Works project, with support from the SFMTA. ## **ONGOING: SFPUC Geary Boulevard Sewer and Water Replacements**

Due to construction work at multiple locations, some of the bus stops for Muni routes 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid will be temporarily relocated nearby.
